


Saturday, October 29th

Kim is excited to be returning to the PTO board working as the Communication Chair. She has a second grader and future cougar at home.


Kim has a number of hobbies and favorites. She loves to quilt, garden, and cook. Because of these many loves it is hard for her to narrow down her favorite color or foods.

Student Council Election Process:

- All interested third, fourth, and fifth grade student attend an informational meeting in September to learn about Student Council roles and responsibilities.
- Interested students are given a ballot sheet and are required to have twenty signatures supporting that their name be placed on the ballot. Forms must be returned by October 20, 2016 to Mrs. Borders in room 225.
- 3. Students who return their forms and meet the requirements will be notified by a meeting and a letter. Students will prepare three campaign posters to hang, and must prepare a speech for their fellow students on why they would be a good candidate and how they uphold the values of the Carpenter community.
- 4. Elections will be held on November 3, 2016.
- All third, fourth, and fifth graders will be granted the opportunity to vote electronically after the election speeches have been delivered by the candidates. The votes will be counted and the winners will be announced at the end of the day.
- If you are not elected to an Executive Board position, you will still have
 opportunities to demonstrate your student leadership. There will be opportunities
 for additional involvement as a classroom representative and/or through other
 Carpenter committees.
