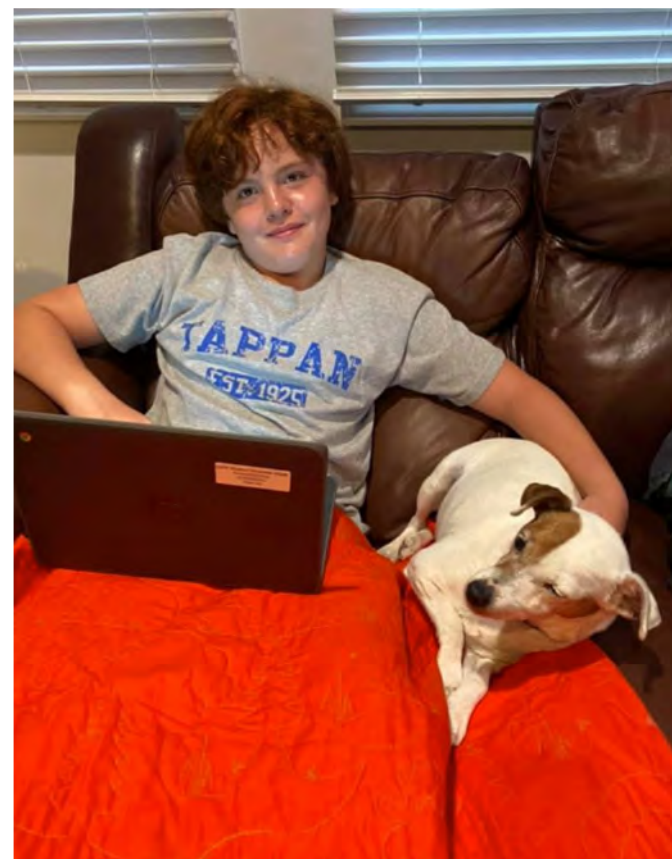

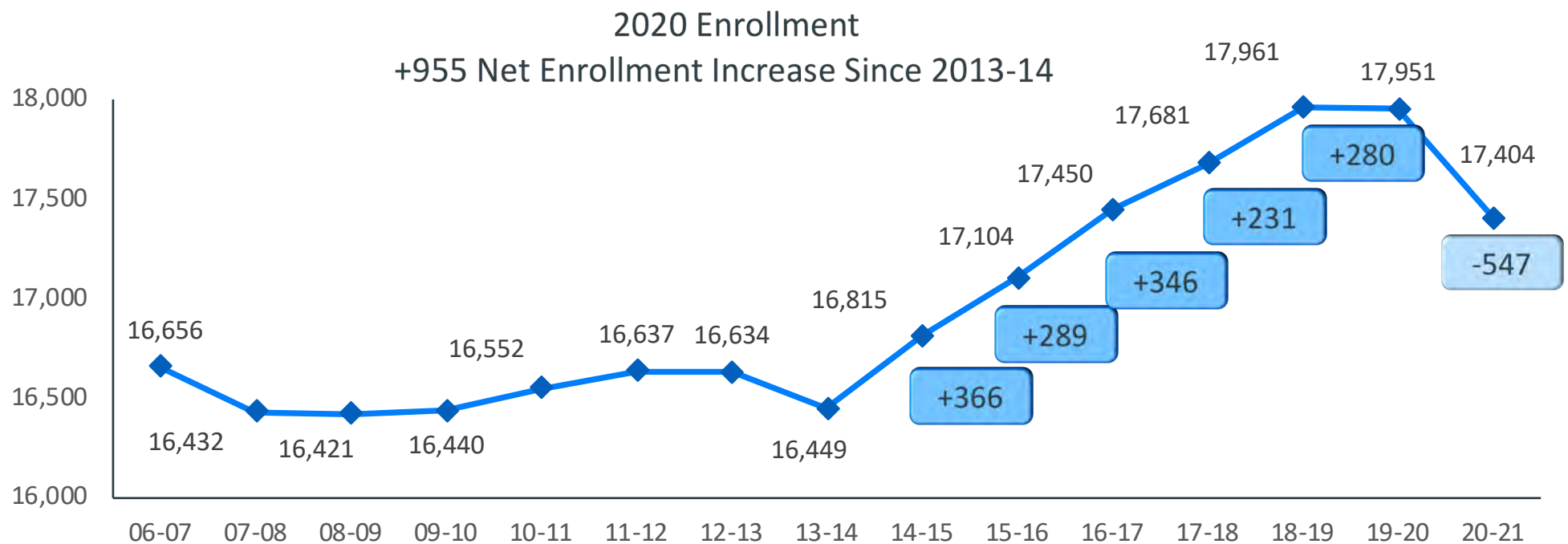

Overall Student Headcount

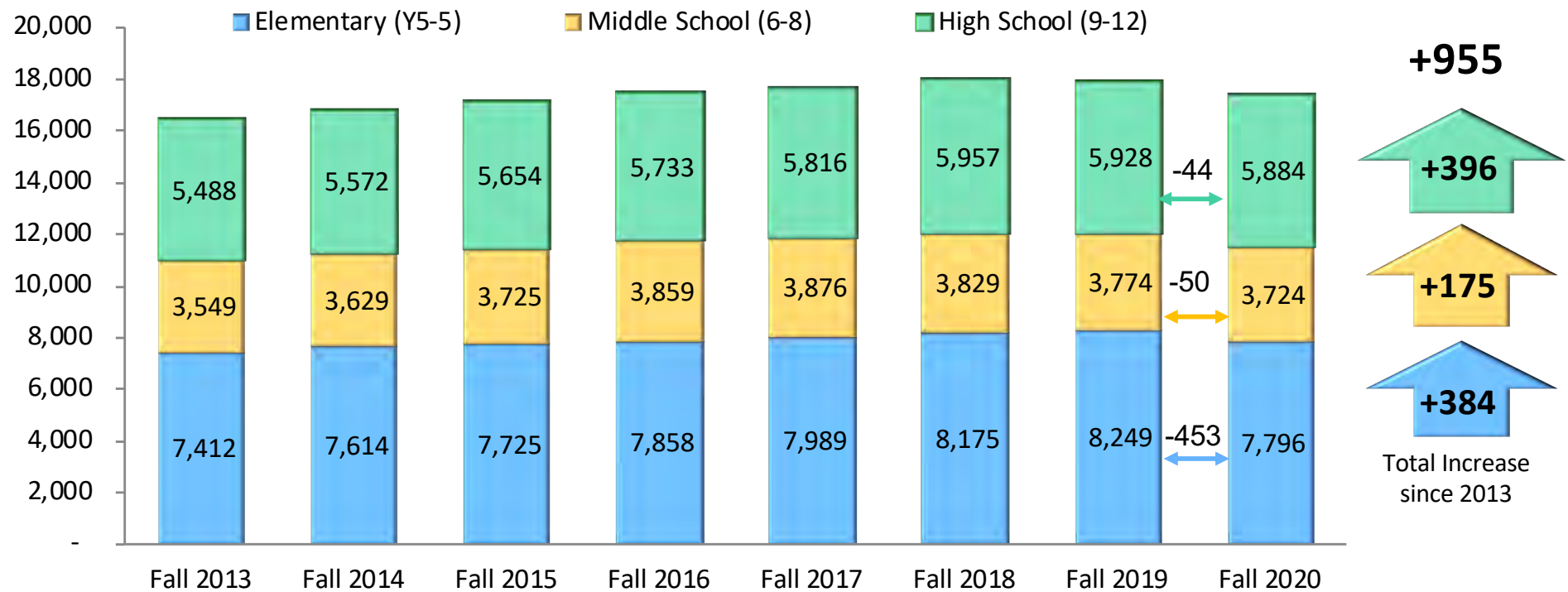

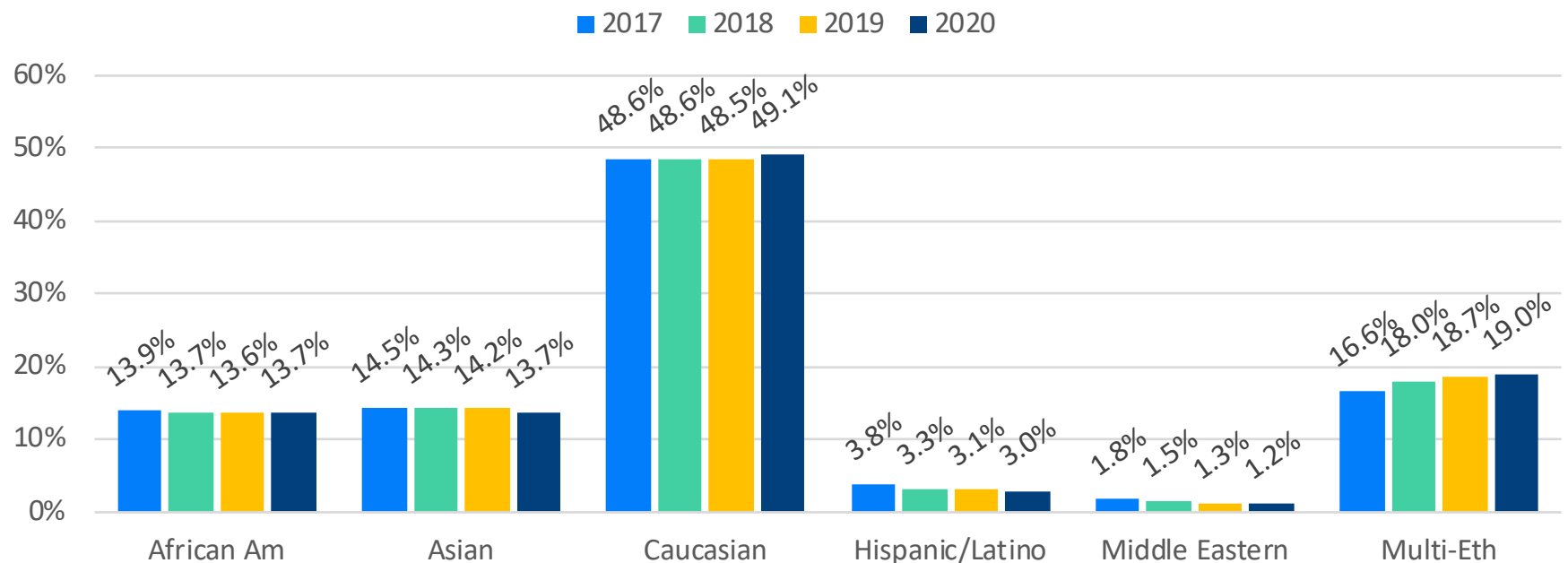
Enrollment Increase By Level - Fall 2013-2020

Y5-12 Students – District Total Ethnicity

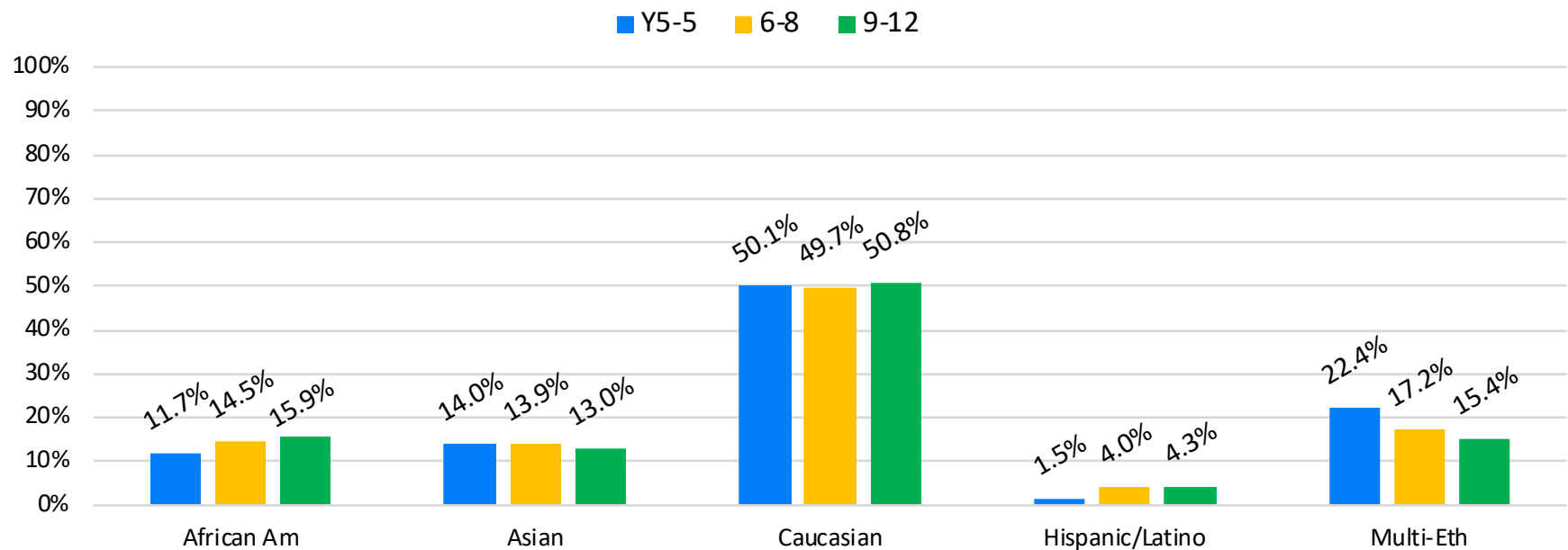

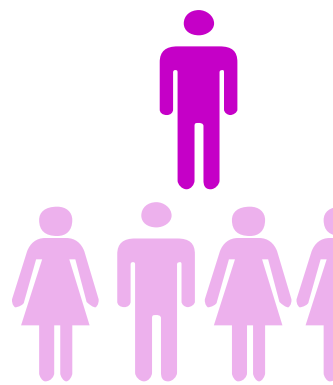

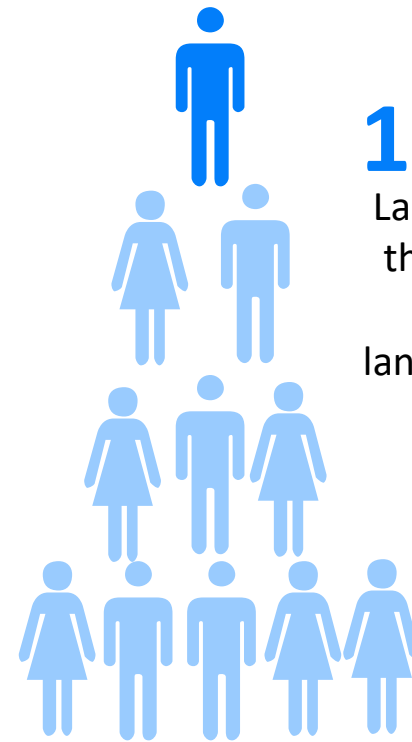

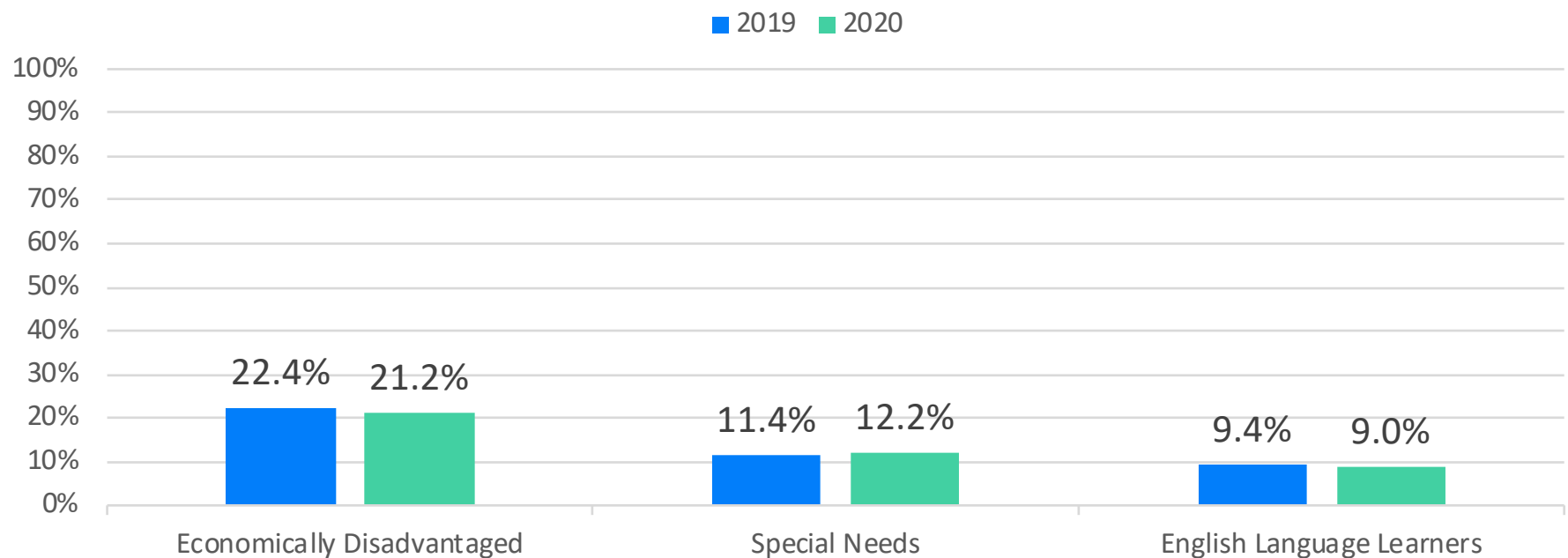

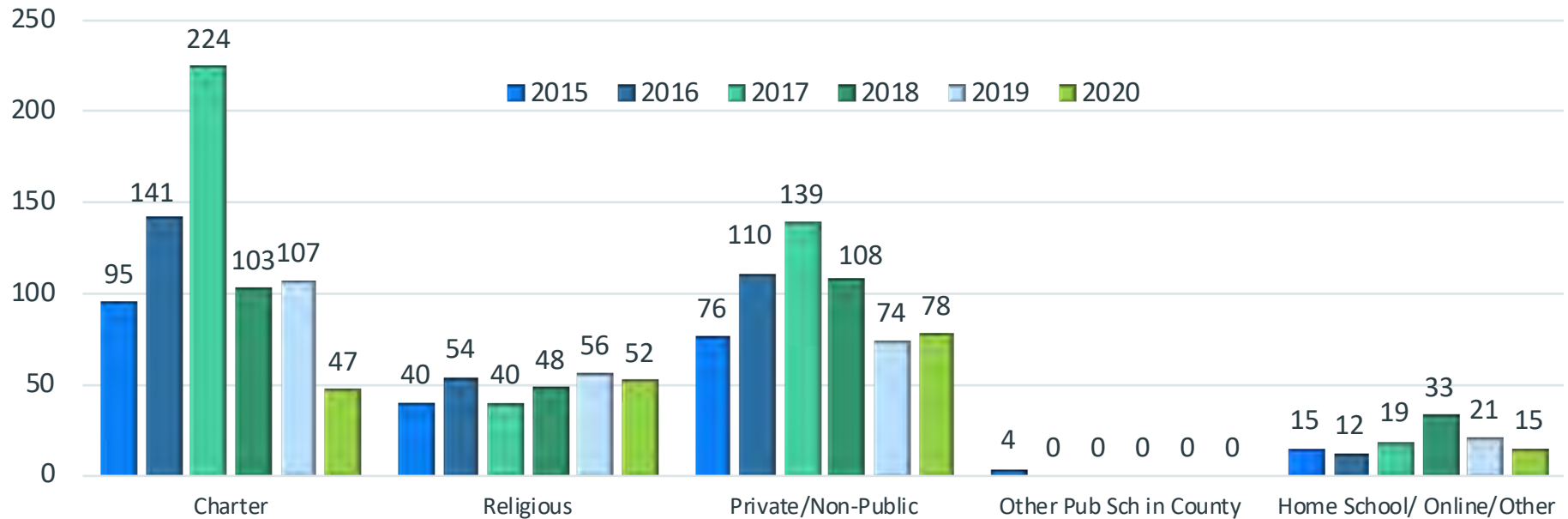

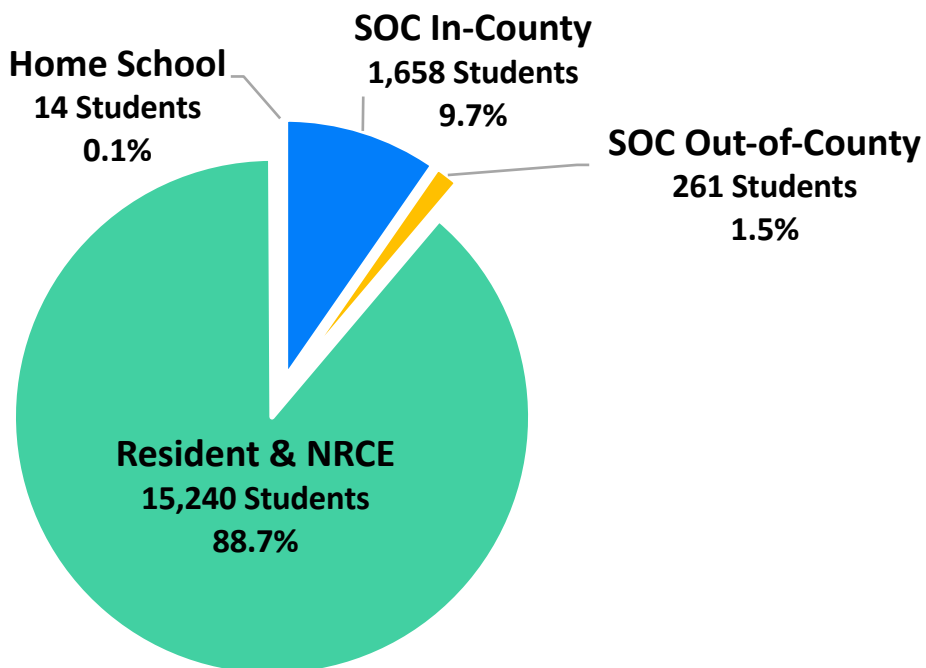

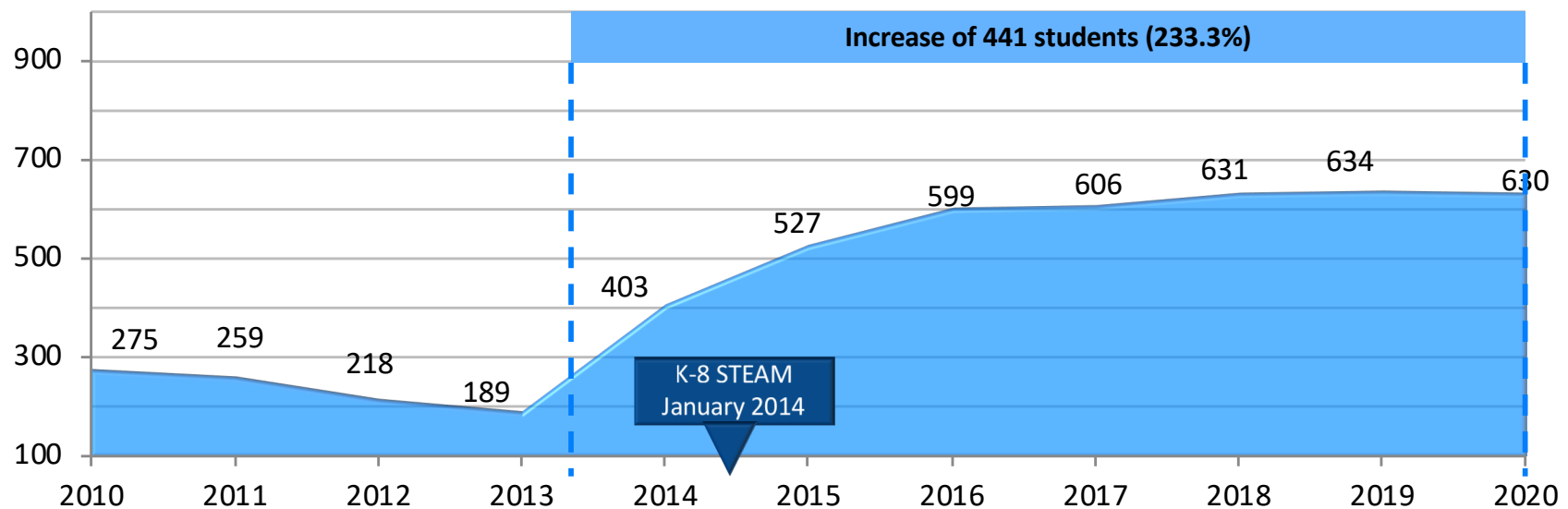

Arrivals & Departures: A community on the move

- ▣ Ongoing COVID impact
- ▣ High rate of mobility – incoming & outgoing - is the nature of AAPS community
- ▣ Continue evaluation & consideration of short, mid, and long-term space needs with particular focus on elementary
- ▣ Explore capacity planning for locations where demand out-paces supply: Northeast, South and South West
- ▣ Continue planning to prepare for new housing developments
- ▣ Continue to monitor and specialize programming to balance high school enrollment going forward
- ▣ Evaluate space/capacity and planning to prepare for 2021-2022 enrollment windows
- ▣ Board update on Growth/Development (January 2021)
- ▣ Amended enrollment process Spring 2021
