Modular Classrooms


Sinking Fund - \$2,695,722

Mitchell

- New modular addition will connect to the 4 classroom addition built Summer, 2017
- 6 classrooms, 1 flex room, 2 three-fixture restrooms and 2 offices

Wines

- Existing 2 classroom modular will be demolished
- New modular addition includes: 6 classrooms, 1 flex room, 2 three-fixture restrooms, 2 offices and a covered walkway to the school



Tennis Court Renewal Project

Sinking Fund - Design Phase

- Project includes selective reconstruction, cleaning, repairs, drainage improvement, resealing and repainting of majority of the tennis courts
- Extensive rebuild anticipated at 2 of the courts at Forsythe and 5 of the courts at Huron
- A total of 36 Tennis Courts will be refurbished at the following schools:
 - A2 Open/Mack
 - Forsythe Middle School
 - Huron High School
 - Pioneer High School

- Scarlett Middle School
- Skyline High School
- Tappan Middle School

Sinking Fund - Design Phase

Based on highest need and available funding, the following locations will receive

paving reconstruction:

- Angell Elementary will include repairs to the storm drains below parking areas
- King Elementary
- Mitchell Elementary



Facade Restorations

Sinking Fund - Design Phase

- Slauson and Tappan Middle Schools were built in 1937 and 1950, respectively
- Both have multi-story masonry facades in need of restorative maintenance



Slauson Middle School

- Restorations Timing
 - Engineering Work
 - Phase I Restoration highest parts of each building (Summer 2018)
 - Phase II Restoration lower parts of each building (Summer 2019)



Tappan Middle School

Haisley Additional Classroom

Sinking Fund - Design Phase

Work Scope Includes:

- Addition of 1 classroom
- Relocate current Computer Lab
- Divide existing Teacher's Lounge into a Computer Lab & Classroom



A2 STEAM 2nd Floor Air Conditioning Installation *Sinking Fund - \$189,150*

- Portions of the building are subject to extreme heat at certain times of the year and this project will bring air conditioning to:
 - 11 2nd Floor Classrooms
 - STEAM Lab
 - Counseling Offices
- Upgrades will also allow for Summer Programming at A2 STEAM



Additionally, the semi-private counseling offices will be renovated into fully enclosed offices for student privacy

Skyline Natatorium Ductwork *Sinking Fund - Out to Bid*

Replace existing fabric ventilation distribution system with metal ductwork

Huron HVAC Project

Sinking Fund - \$760,769

- Replacement of Air Handling Unit for the Fitness Center and associated rooms below the Main Gym at Huron High School
- Scope includes:
 - Converting new air handling unit to variable volume reheat system
 - New ceiling and lights
 - Cleaning of existing ductwork
 - New controls
 - Sprinkler system repairs



Mitchell Enhancements

Sinking Fund and General Fund


- Mitchell has seen increased student population due to growth of the International Baccalaureate Program and will receive the following enhancements:
 - New PreK playground and fencing
 - Improvements to cafeteria to accommodate 2 service lines at lunch
 - Replacement of broken cafeteria tables
 - Installation of 12 international flagpoles (also at Scarlett)
 - Introduction of selected paint colors to tie addition and building together



Freeman Life Safety and ADA Upgrades

Sinking Fund and 2015 Bond

- AAPS will regain possession of Freeman School on July 1st and in order to use the building for educational programing will make the following minimum improvements:
 - Fire Alarm System Installation
 - Security Cameras Installation
 - Review ADA requirements and update as needed



Classroom Enhancement – Furniture

2015 Bond - \$676,187

- Continuing the Bond 2015 Advisory Committee recommendations:
 - Furniture is scheduled for June delivery to Slauson and Tappan Middle Schools
 - Furniture purchase recommendation submitted to Board of Education briefing/action for Pioneer, Huron, Skyline, Pathways, and Community High Schools
 - Additional furniture will be ordered for other locations to be delivered in August, to accommodate enrollment growth



New Buses 2015 Bond - \$2,283,201

- 20 Regular Education and 3 Preschool buses have been ordered for delivery in late June
 - This is in addition to 71 buses purchased since 2015, for a total of 94 new buses




Security Assessment

2015 Bond - \$82,500

- > Secure Education Consultants will conduct Security and Site Assessments of all school campuses and update Emergency Floor Plans at each location
- Security and Site Assessments will be completed in May during a 2-6 hour visit per location
- > A report will include their evaluation of the following:
 - Internal and External Design Features
 - Technical and Physical Security Features
 - Safety and Security Policies and Procedures
 - Emergency Equipment (panic buttons, cameras, door entry systems, etc.)
- The findings will be compiled in a report outlining best value investments for providing enhanced security in AAPS buildings

Security Assessment (cont'd) 2015 Bond - \$16,500

- Secure Education Consultants will also use the data collected to create Emergency Floor Plans that will include:
 - Primary and secondary evacuation routes
 - Shelter locations
 - First aid locations
 - Fire extinguisher locations
 - AED locations
 - Other relevant data



Technology Refresh – Teacher Laptops

2012 Bond - \$2,021,600

Continuing the Tech Bond Plan, a Technology Refresh of Teacher Model Laptops will replace the current teacher, counselor, Support Services laptops

Additionally, the refresh of student laptops and District copiers is in the

planning phase



Facility Conditions Assessment

General Fund - \$210,702

EMG has been retained to conduct Facility Condition Assessments of all District facilities, which will include:

- Evaluating building and site systems conditions
 - Mechanical, Electrical, and Plumbing systems
 - Paving and walkways
 - Exterior envelope including doors, windows, and roofs
 - Interior finishes
 - Sports fields and related apparatuses
 - Fire alarm systems
- Assigning annual and 10-year costs for capital improvements
- A comprehensive database for use in planning and establishing preventive maintenance schedules
- Report to BOE and Community, Fall, 2018
