Purpose of the Study

Positive school climate is an essential component of successful and effective schools. It is defined as shared beliefs, values, and attitudes that shape interactions between students, teachers, and administrators, while setting the parameters of acceptable behavior and norms for the school.

Ann Arbor Public Schools (AAPS) is committed to supporting continuous improvement in our schools. As part of this effort, we conducted the 2017-2018 School Climate Surveys, which asked staff, parents, and students in grades 3-12 for feedback on the many aspects of school culture that make our schools great places to learn, work, and belong.

K12 *Insight* partnered with Dawn Linden, executive director of elementary education, to develop the surveys, which addressed the following topics:

- Academic preparation
- Student support and engagement
- Respect for diversity
- School leadership
- Parent engagement and involvement
- Safety and behavior
- School operations

The surveys also addressed other topics relevant to specific participant groups, such as faculty relations, guidance counseling, teacher quality, busing, bullying, and program evaluation.



Details of the Study

The surveys were open from April 3 to April 27. Email invitations with unique survey links were sent to AAPS parents and staff members. Parents and staff members also could participate via a public link on the district's website. Reminders were sent April 11, 18, and 24. The survey was translated into Arabic, Chinese, Japanese, Korean, and Spanish.

Students used their student IDs to access the survey in school.

Pre-survey communications included letters, a newsletter, morning announcements, social media posts, and news items.

This report summarizes survey results and breaks them down by parents, staff members, high school students, middle school students, and elementary school students. Results are compared with those from 2013-2014, 2014-2015, 2015-2016, and 2016-2017. Reports for each school are included in this project.

The survey of elementary school students (grades 3-5) was substantially different from the surveys of parents, staff members, and middle school and high school students (grades 6-12), which prevented comparison with the other participant groups over time.

Results do not reflect random sampling; therefore, they should not be generalized to all AAPS parents, staff members, and students in grades 3-12. Rather, results reflect only the perceptions and opinions of survey participants.

The five-year change is calculated by subtracting the combined percentage of favorable responses in 2013-2014 from the percentage of favorable responses in 2017-2018. If the item or dimension was not in the 2013-2014 survey, then the first year data was collected for that item or dimension was used to make the calculation.

Findings for each item in the report exclude participants who did not answer. In some charts and graphs, data labels less than 5 percent are not shown. Percentages may not total 100 due to rounding.









Next Steps




- Though there were increases in agreement from one year to the next for the first few years these surveys were administered, the amount of agreement has plateaued.
- It may be beneficial to revise the survey to ask about different aspects of the educational experience. It is time to consider a deeper approach to key and critical priorities of the educational experience, ex. Student safety, respect for diversity, and academic preparation.
- Priority will be to align the survey with new AAPS Strategic Plan and it may also be beneficial to use survey items that will allow the district to be compared to a national benchmark.

Dimension Comparison: 2017-2018




Dimension Scores: Comparison by Respondent Type








Dimension Scores (N=3,326)






Dimension Comparison Over Time






Overall Perception of School Quality










