


AAPS Strategic Partnerships and Community Engagement Purpose

- Strategic support for students and schools
 - Connect the resources of the Ann Arbor community to school district priorities in ways that directly benefit students and student achievement.
 - Build and strengthen relationships with university, business, government, and nonprofit partners to support students and schools.

Monetary and In-Kind support for students and schools.

Consultation Assistance to Schools & Teams

District level consultation on school-based partnerships, volunteers, resources and more.

Building relationships with and involving the community in our schools.

Guiding Principles for Partnership Work

Focus on Equity

- Equitable, intentional distribution of volunteers and other resources.
- Fill opportunity gaps Access to career role models, speakers and enrichment opportunities that students might not otherwise have.
- Complement Teaching and Learning
 - Collaborate with Teaching and Learning Staff
 - Connect Partnership work with student achievement
- Create Lasting Systems and Connections
 - Clear Process and Structure for Partnerships and Volunteers
 - Navigation access to community resources





How Strategic Partnerships Benefit Students

- Increased opportunities to explore business interests, real world careers and more.
- Increased access to academic and social emotional support during and after school.
- Enhanced connections to positive adult role models.
- Wraparound support for students and families who need it the most.

District Level Partnerships to support students and schools


What are Strategic Partnerships?

- District-level partnerships with businesses, educational entities, community organizations or groups that bring in resources to support AAPS schools aligned with AAPS's priority areas.
- Strategic Partnership Characteristics:
 - Strategic (aligned with district priorities)
 - Long term and committed
 - Mutually beneficial and collaborative
 - Capacity to plan, evaluate and evolve the partnership





What is a Strategic Partnership Volunteer?


- Volunteers recruited and oriented through Strategic Partnerships Office.

 U-M students in courses, classes, or groups.
- Intentional placements—targeting roles and schools with most need.
- 220 AAPS Frequent Strategic Partnership Volunteers this fall.

Strategic Partnership VolunteersFall 2022 By the Numbers




Strategic Partnership Volunteers Fall 2022 By the Numbers



Volunteer Support Aligned with Teaching and Learning

Literacy/Math Support Volunteer Pilot Program

- Collaboration with Elementary ELA Coordinator and Literacy/Math Coaches to develop a volunteer model and training based on best practices.
- Volunteers receive specific training and supervision from Literacy/Math Coaches.
- ▶ ~30 volunteers: Retired teachers, parents, America Reads tutors, U-M students, RSVP volunteers, Rotary.
- ▶ 10 Schools: A2Steam, A2Open, Angell, Abbot, Allen, Carpenter, Dicken, Lawton, Logan, Pittsfield.


