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






#### Fall 2023 Student Enrollment by School Year






From Fall 2019-Fall 2022: AAPS decreased by **5.3%** MI decreased by **4.1%**



From Fall 2002-Fall 2022: AAPS enrollment <u>increased</u> by 325 students **(+1.9%)** Washtenaw County schools enrollment <u>decreased</u> by 3,234 students **(-6.9%)**


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AAPS Kindergarten and Y5 Enrollment/Washtenaw County Live Births (+5 years)





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Net Enrollment Increase since Fall 2023 Student Enrollment: 4 Year Comparison Y5-12 Student Race/Ethnicity





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



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
Student Enrollment Representation Over Time, Fall 2013 through Fall 2022








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# Fall 2023 Student Enrollment Highlights



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# **2023 Student Enrollment Report – Summary**

#### Enrollment numbers are showing signs of stability:

- For the second year in a row, we have less than a 0.5% change in overall enrollment
- Despite birthrate drops in the county, we still see growth over the same timeframe in our Y5/K enrollment, with Participation in Young 5s program is rebounding towards pre-pandemic levels
- Taking a longer view, enrollment numbers have remained strong and even increased over the last two decades while trends in the state and county have shown decreases during the same timeframe

#### Other observations:

- AAPS continues to serve a diverse student population, and have seen growth in our populations of both English Learners and students with IEPs
- AAPS continues to demonstrate high mobility rates students in and out, which is part of the nature of our community
- Overall AAPS residency of 89.7% is strong and consistent with prior years, but Schools of Choice is the most obvious lever we have to impact enrollment: over the last 2 Fall Counts, we have accepted 100 less SOC students, and our overall enrollment has gone down by 100 students

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New special programs implemented during the last decade continue to show strong enrollment

We continue evaluation & consideration of short, mid, and long-term space needs with particular focus on elementary
