- Ms. Minnick presented the **Monthly Budget Monitoring Report for February**. All revenues and expenses are within normal ranges.
- Ms. Bacolor shared a preview of **2017 summer camps** that will be offered through Rec & Ed. 207 camps will be offered with additional slots available in many of the popular camps. New camps include Farm, Field & Forest, Careers in Art, Sports Broadcasting, Engineering a Sustainable Future, Baseball and Preschool Hoops.

Ms. Hein presented a recommendation to purchase 4 modular teaching additions to accommodate increased student growth at Mitchell, Thurston, King and Burns Park. The bid award is recommended to Innovative Modular Solutions, Inc. in the amount of \$2,954,440.

The Board Approved...

Refunding of 2008 Bonds to take advantage of favorable market conditions and lower interest rates. The refunding will ultimately reduce the interest costs of the bonds by \$1.1M.

Information to the Board

- Dr. Swift presented the Student Conduct Report for 2015-16. A 43% overall decrease in rates of suspension have been realized over the last 6 years. It was noted that the rates of suspension among African American, special economically education and disadvantaged students is higher than other groups and that the district is concentrating efforts to address these disparities. Mr. DeAngelis, Ms. Linden and Ms. Parks presented the various behavior support plans that are having a positive effect on overall suspension and discipline at each level. steps include adding elementary Intervention Specialists, continuing professional learning for building leaders and staff and strengthening social/emotional proactive supports programming.
- Dr. Swift presented information about the **impact to Medicaid funding for special education students** under the proposed Federal budget recommendation.

Information to the Board

- Dr. Swift presented the **Spring 2017 Student Enrollment Update.** Data presented detailed information about incoming students through the Schools of Choice (SOC) option. New SOC students enrolled for fall 2016 total 445, which includes 112 current students who moved out of the district, but were able to remain in AAPS through SOC. Overall, 7.6% of total district enrollment is attributable to Schools of Choice.
- The final informational material and video for the 2017 Sinking Fund Millage Proposal was presented. This information will be available on the website and at all school locations.

Each Building leader will present the information to their staff and parent community. Community Information meetings will be held at each of the 5 middle schools.

The Board Approved...

A Limited School of Choice option for the 2017/18 school year.
