

BRIEFING ITEMS

- [Civil Engineering Services](#) – Mr. Lauzzana is recommending pre-qualifying firms for civil engineering services on Sinking Fund and Bond Program projects. The scope of services includes design, engineering, bidding and construction administration for projects such as stormwater improvements, parking lot reconstruction, non-motorized transportation improvements, site safety reviews, ADA accessibility reviews, landscape design and sustainability improvements. A three-year contract with two optional one-year renewals is recommended to award to Midwestern Consulting, LLC of Ann Arbor, OHM Advisors of Ann Arbor, and Spalding DeDecker of Novi. Fees are based on the complexity of the projects and will be funded through the Sinking Fund and/or the Bond Program, where appropriate.
- [2022 Roof Repair / Replacement](#): King Elementary, Mitchell Elementary, Pattengill Elementary, Pioneer High School, Westerman Preschool. For summer roofing projects a contract award is recommended to Bloom Roofing, Brighton, MI for the procurement, installation and related construction of roof replacements at Mitchell Elementary and Pattengill Elementary, and roof repairs and coatings at King Elementary, Pioneer High, and Westerman Preschool. The total amount of \$1,656,147, which includes a 15% contingency, will be paid from the Sinking Fund.
- [Rooftop Solar Array Installations](#): Pioneer High School and Westerman Preschool – As part of the AAPS commitment to sustainability and environmentally responsible infrastructure, approval is sought for solar panel installations at Pioneer High School and Westerman Preschool. A contract to Homeland Builders (dba Homeland Solar) of Ann Arbor, MI, is recommended for the procurement, installation and related construction of solar array panels at Pioneer High School and Westerman Preschool in the amount of \$728,498 to be paid from the Sinking Fund. A contingency of 10%, or \$72,850, is also recommended for a total award of \$801,348.
- [Pioneer High School Theater Seating](#) – As part of the Pioneer High School Shreiber Auditorium and Little Theater restoration project, purchase and installation of theater seating from The Irwin Seating Company of Grand Rapids, MI, in the amount of \$465,738 is recommended, funding provided from the Bond Program.
- [Technology Refresh](#) – Infrastructure Storage Solution replacement is recommended to replace the aged storage equipment with a modern and fully redundant hyperconverged (HCI) solution to support a complex, distributed, multi-domain world that encompasses enterprise data centers; campus, branch and edge locations as well as private and public clouds. A contract to Sentinel Technologies of Downers Grove, IL, in the amount not to exceed \$1,009,181.51, is recommended with funding provided by the Technology Bond.

- Approved [AN-2066: Civil Engineering Services](#) - three-year contracts with two optional one-year renewals, with Midwestern Consulting, LLC of Ann Arbor, MI, OHM Advisors of Ann Arbor, MI, and Spalding DeDecker of Novi, MI, for civil engineering services to support Sinking Fund and Bond Program projects to be paid from the Sinking Fund and Bond Program funds.

- Approve [AN-2067: 2022 Roof Repair / Replacement: King Elementary, Mitchell Elementary, Pattengill Elementary, Pioneer High School, Westerman Preschool](#) - a contract to Bloom Roofing of Brighton, MI, for the procurement, installation and related construction of a roof replacement, Mitchell Elementary School and Pattengill Elementary School, and roof repairs and coatings at King Elementary School, Pioneer High School, and Westerman Preschool, for a combined project amount of \$1,440,128, and a contingency of \$216,019, for a total award of \$1,656,147, to be paid from the Sinking Fund.
- Approved [AN-2068: Rooftop Solar Array Installations: Pioneer High School and Westerman Preschool](#) - a contract to Homeland Builders (dba Homeland Solar) of Ann Arbor, MI, for the procurement, installation and related construction of solar array panels at Pioneer High School and Westerman Preschool in the amount of \$728,498, to be paid from the Sinking Fund. A contingency of 10%, or \$72,850, is also recommended for a total award of \$801,348.
- Approved [AN-2069: Pioneer High School Theater Seating](#) - purchase of theater seating and installation for Schreiber Auditorium and the Little Theater at Pioneer High School from The Irwin Seating Company of Grand Rapids, MI, in the amount of \$465,738, to be paid from the Bond Program funds.
- Approved [AN-2070: Technology Refresh - Infrastructure Storage Solution](#) - contract award Sentinel Technologies of Downers Grove, Illinois, in an amount not to exceed \$1,009,181.51, for an HCI storage solution refreshment with funding provided by the Technology Bond Fund.
