- [Approved AN-2092 Classroom Furniture Purchase for Newly Constructed Middle School Classrooms](#) - a contract for the procurement and installation of supplemental middle school furniture from Great Lakes Furniture Supply, Inc. of Holland, MI, in the amount of \$83,885.60, to be paid from the Bond Program Funds.

- [Approved 2022-23 Air Conditioning and Lighting Projects - Additional Bid Categories: AN-2089 Bach, AN-2090 Eberwhite, AN-2091 Forsythe and Wines](#) - contracts as follows: AN-2089: for the procurement and installation of roofing and acoustical ceilings required to accommodate air-conditioning and lighting upgrades at Bach Elementary School to CEI Michigan, LLC of Hamburg, MI, in the amount of \$216,977 and Pontiac Ceiling and Partition, LLC of Pontiac, MI, in the amount of \$189,250, plus a 10% contingency in the amount of \$40,623, for a total recommended amount of \$446,850, to be paid from the Bond Program Funds. AN-2090: for the procurement and installation of roofing required to accommodate air conditioning and lighting upgrades at Eberwhite Elementary School to CEI Michigan, LLC of Hamburg, MI, in the amount of \$22,000, plus a 10% contingency in the amount of \$2,200, for a total recommended amount of \$24,200, to be paid from the Bond Program Funds. AN-2091: for the procurement and installation of mechanical system controls at both Wines Elementary School and Forsythe Middle School to Metro Controls Inc. of Clinton Township, MI, in the amount of \$1,367,940, plus a 10% contingency in the amount of \$136,794, for a total recommended amount of \$1,504,734, to be paid from the Bond Program Funds.
