Those who are not covered by an insurance that U of M accepts may pay \$44 for the flu shot by check or credit card.

For patients over the age of 65 and given a High Dose flu shot and are not covered by an insurance U of M accepts may pay \$67.60 by check or credit card.

If your insurance plan does not cover our services, your insurer will deny payment and payment will become your responsibility. We recommend you be familiar with and verify your benefits with your insurance company prior to receiving our services.
