Valley Crossing Elementary School (VCES) serves students in kindergarten through fifth grades and is part of SoWashCo Schools.

VCES offers the district's Multiage Magnet Program, in which teachers work with students for two years at a time, allowing them to develop deeper relationships. VCES is also home to the district's Gateway Program which services students in an all advanced-learner environment. Students are placed into the Gateway Program based on need indicated by data.

VCES uses the Responsive Classroom (RC) approach in all spaces throughout the building.
