About Park High School

Park High School (PHS) is a comprehensive four-year public high school located in Cottage Grove, Minnesota. High school classes are scheduled in a six-period day with three trimesters (12 weeks each) in a grading period.

PHS emphasizes culturally competent communication, collaboration, and critical thinking, preparing students for post-secondary success and global citizenship. As an International Baccalaureate (IB) World School, PHS offers rigorous academic pathways, including AP and Concurrent Enrollment courses, as well as trade and industry programs supported by 3M grants. Daily ACE (Academics, Connections, Excellence) time provides tailored academic support and enrichment. PHS's Community Inclusion Center offers a safe, welcoming space for students, staffed by cultural liaisons and Promise Fellows who foster belonging and advocate for students and families.

Grading and Ranking Procedures

GPA is based on marks earned in grades 9–12. All courses for which the student receives a grade A–F are included in the GPA. Pass grades are not included in the GPA, but do count for credit (a maximum of two credits per year may be taken with the pass/no credit option).

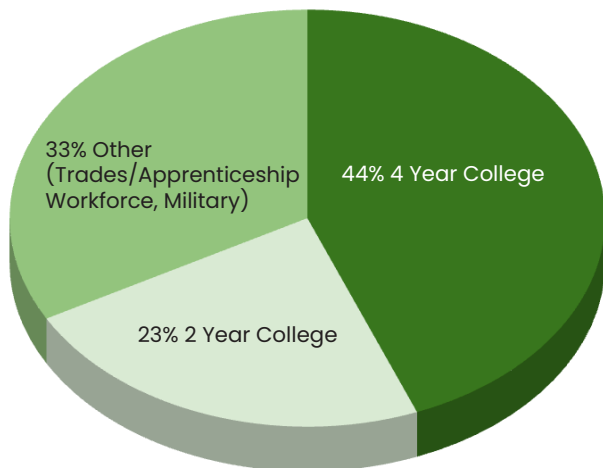

PHS is an International Baccalaureate (IB) World School, offering the internationally-recognized IB diploma program. This program aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.

Students may elect to take a number of IB courses or pursue the full IB diploma. IB courses include English, History, Spanish, German, Math including two-year Calculus, Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Sports Exercise/Health Sciences, Psychology, Music and Visual Arts.
