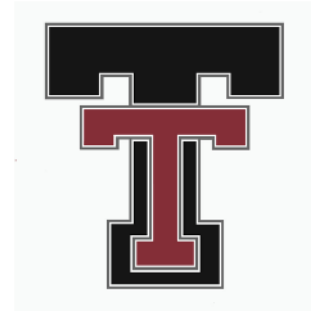

Bell Schedule and COVID-19 Impact: Tualatin High School is on a two semester rotating block schedule, where students have the opportunity to take 8 classes a semester and attend 4 classes each day.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Tigard-Tualatin School District closed its buildings from March 13, 2020, through the end of the 2019-2020 school year. Per a mandate from the Oregon Department of Education, instruction was delivered through Comprehensive Distance Learning and Pass/Incomplete grades were given for all second semester (June 2020) classes and grade levels.

During the 2020-2021 we were in Comprehensive Distance Learning for the first 3 quarters (Sept-mid April). We were on a 4x4 block schedule where students had the opportunity to take 4 classes each of our 4 quarters. In April families had the educational choice of hybrid (coming into the building for 2 days a week and staying online for the remainder of the week) or staying 100% online. Letter grades were awarded and if a student didn't pass a class a NG (No Grade) was assigned.

Since the Pandemic F grades are transcribed as NG, No Grade, and not calculated in a students GPA.

Dual Credit Offerings: Tualatin High School is able to offer dual credit with local colleges in math, science, writing, world languages, digital arts, business, computer technology, culinary arts, and child development. Students will earn college credit as well as high school credit by taking these courses.

Career and Technical Education: Students have the ability to enroll in CTE classes at Tualatin High School that introduce them to multiple career areas. CTE classes are in the area of business, computer technology, construction, digital arts, culinary arts, digital photography, child development, engineering, and health occupations.

Community Experiences for Career Education (CE)2: (CE)2 is an alternative program where students earn high school credit by working at a local business, learning valuable job-related skills four days a week, while completing their core academic classes through packets and online curriculum in their in-center day.
