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## Academic Excellence

During the 2022-23 school year, schools within the SDWD received either three-star or four-star ratings on the state-issued DPI report cards. Specifically, Lake Delton Elementary and Wisconsin Dells High School each earned four-star ratings, while both the MS and SHE increased their scores from the prior year. Overall, members of the class of 2023 exceeded the state average on the state-mandated ACT assessment, showing positive growth from their 9th and 10th-grade pre-ACT scores. Our middle school students in grades 6-8 posted the highest Forward Assessment achievement data in the area. Lastly, our elementary school students across the district demonstrate above-average achievement scores on their Forward scores.

When successfully completed, students can earn technical college credit, saving students future tuition costs.</li> <li>WDHS students have access to seven "in-house" Advanced Placement courses: AP English (Literature &amp; Composition), AP English (Language &amp; Composition), AP Biology, AP Calculus, AP Statistics, AP US History, AP World History. Many WDHS graduates leave high school having earned a semester's worth of college credits. This is further proof of their college readiness as well as saving a semester's worth of tuition.</li> <li>Graduating students of WDHS are generously supported through the work of the Wisconsin Dells Education Foundation and other local non-profit organizations. In the spring of 2023, members of this graduating class were awarded \$367,000 from the WDEF and an additional \$113,950 in scholarships for a total of \$480,950.
