### District Hosts Ceremony For Harvest Ridge Elementary School

Elgin ISD on Sept. 22 hosted a Topping Out ceremony for Harvest Ridge Elementary at the school's future site.

Topping Out ceremonies can be traced back to Scandinavian traditions in which pine trees were placed atop the highest beams of buildings under construction. In modern times, an individual steel beam is signed by various people before being hoisted into position.

The Harvest Ridge event included a pine tree and a beam signed by school district representatives, as well as by representatives of Harvest Ridge neighborhood developer Brohn Homes and companies involved in the construction of Harvest Ridge: LAN Consulting, Satterfield and Pontikes Construction, and Pfluger Architects.

Elgin ISD School Board Vice President Beth Walterscheidt and Superintendent Dr. Jana Rueter addressed the crowd at the event, as did Nicholas Thanos of LAN. At the end of the ceremony, the beam was hoisted into position at the future entrance of the two-story school.

Harvest Ridge is slated for completion in fall 2024.



Our thanks to everyone who was able to attend. We look forward to seeing you again!




#### Dr. Borowicz Honored By TMEA
