7th Grade Band

Course Description (from the Course Catalog)

Band 7 923107

This course is for students who have successfully completed the 6th grade band class. Students will refine and develop their playing skills and expand their musical vocabulary. Scale knowledge will increase to include 4 Major Scales, and a one octave Chromatic Scale. They will perform music from the VBODA Grade Level 1-2 lists. Students are required to participate in at least three concerts a year and are expected to practice outside of class to fully develop their skills and understanding.

Curriculum Overview

Essential Skills/ Processes: Students will -

Technique: (SOL MIB.10-11,15)

- Demonstrate Proper posture and playing position
- Demonstrate proper breath support, embouchure, and characteristic tone for the instrument
- Demonstrate through performance, appropriate musicianship and interpretation of band literature
- Demonstrate correct fingerings/stickings and articulations: including tonguing, slurring, staccato, accent, marcato, legato, sforzando, and tenuto.
- Demonstrate the knowledge of alternate fingerings

Music Theory: (SOL's MIB.1-9, 16)

- Demonstrate through counting and playing, simple rhythmic notation and recognize the following time signatures: 2/4, 3/4, 4/4, Common Time, Cut Time, and 6/8
- The students will perform rhythms and rhythmic patterns, including whole notes, half notes, quarter notes, 8th notes, 16th notes, dotted half notes, dotted quarter notes, and corresponding rests.
- Name and recognize notes, including enharmonic notes, in all music performed
- Demonstrate one octave F, Bb, Eb, and Ab Major scales, as well as a one octave chromatic scale
- Snare drum rudiments as follow: Long Roll, 5 Stroke Roll, 7 Stroke Roll, 9 Stroke Roll, Ruff, Flam Paradiddle, and Flam Tap. All rudiments should be played open-close-open.
- Recognize key signatures and accidentals
- Define and apply appropriate music vocabulary
- Create/compose short excerpts/variations from folk songs or etudes.

Ensemble Skills: (SOL MIB.12, 14, 17, 19)

- Making adjustments to facilitate correct intonation
- Respond to basic conducting gestures
- Perform music at appropriate speed/tempo and volume/dynamics
- Demonstrate correct rehearsal/ performance etiquette and stage presence
- Participate in all scheduled performances, including VBODA State Concert Assessment

Music Literature: (SOL's MIB.13, 18, 19)

- Listen to and perform music representing various musical periods, styles, and cultures
- Discuss composers and music history as related to the literature being studied
- Perform music of VBODA Level 1-2

Musical Analysis and Listening Skills: (SOL's MIB.17, 19, 20, 21)

- Recognize and play longer (4+ measure) phrases correctly, identifying them as a musical idea
- Describe and critique performances of self and others using music terminology
- Discriminate between melody and harmony
- Recognize form of music being rehearsed/performed
- Identify the ways in which music evokes sensory, emotional, and intellectual responses, including ways in which music can be persuasive, and describing aesthetic criteria used for determining the quality of a work of music or importance of a music style

Instrument Care and Maintenance: (SOL MIB.10)

- Demonstrate proper procedure for handling and storing instrument
- Perform simple maintenance and cleaning as required for each instrument
- Begin to recognize malfunctions in instrument

Careers and Ethics: (SOL's MIB.19)

- Introduction to career options in music
- Describe ethical standards as it applies to copyrighted materials such as printed music and audio recordings
