Building Project

I want to thank the community for passing the referendum. Supporting the building project was an essential piece that should assist in keeping Black Hawk School District viable for many years to come.

We have started a process that has not been done at Black Hawk in 27 years, construction. Actually, if you consider the demolition portion of the project, I am not sure it has ever been done before this time in the Black Hawk School District.

In order to explain where we are at this point I will review some key shifts as we have progressed to this point of the project. The project was originally bid out with bids due in December. Unfortunately, due to unprecedented inflation the lowest bid was three million over. The project was scaled back and then rebid with bids due in February. The bids still came in higher than expected. The Board then made difficult decisions and the bid was granted to Empire Construction. At that point the project was projected to start in April.

Unfortunately, another significant setback occurred when Empire Construction was unable to complete, or even start our project for that matter. At that point the Old Republic Surety stepped in as the bonding company for Empire Construction. They put the project back out to bid to the companies who had bid in February. Eventually the Old Republic chose Sjostrom and Sons to complete the project. It took a few months for the bidding and negotiation process to take place.

The construction process is no longer considered a phased approach. The new addition will be constructed with two portions of the building being demoed at different times. The intent is to have clearance for occupancy by the beginning of the 2024-2025 school year. There will likely be some "punch list" items left to complete after the beginning of the new school year (2024-2025).

For those who have been by the site, you can currently see the new parking area has been significantly completed. Light poles and the final layer of blacktop need to be installed. The footings and foundation work has started. The new water supply has been brought into the building, but is not yet functional. The temporary offices have been constructed and are occupied.

Some key components of the project are planned to occur in the following order. The old office space will be demoed over Christmas break. Work on constructing the new space, classrooms and offices, will be a continuous effort until the work is completed. At the end of the current school year the 1921 portion of the building will be vacated and demolished. The new shed will be constructed in the spring.

I am confident upon completion of the project the students, staff and community will be pleased with the new learning space and functionality of the project.



January is National Winter Sports TBI Awareness Month. Harsh winter days offer thrill-seekers a playground of opportunity to participate in extreme sports, such as snowboarding, skiing, heli-skiing, and snowmobiling. The high velocity, living on the edge sense of adventure makes these sports appealing. There are physical risks associated with such activities, injuries, especially concussions and other traumatic brain injuries (TBI). Sports and recreational activities contribute to about 21% of all traumatic brain injuries among American children and adolescents. A study by Vinay K. Sharma published in the Orthopaedic Journal of Sports Medicine examined the rates of head and neck injuries in three extreme winter sports: snowboarding, snow skiing, snowmobiling; and four extreme summer sports: surfing, skateboarding, mountain biking, and motocross. The study discovered some alarming statistics:

- More than 4 million injuries were reported in the seven sports between 2000 and 2011. Eleven percent involved injuries to the head and neck.
- Skateboarding, snowboarding, skiing, and motocross had the highest number of head and neck injuries.
- Snowboarding and skiing combined accounted for 55% of the reported concussions from all seven sports.
- According to the U.S. Consumer Products Safety Commission, snowboarding is the leading cause of winter sports injuries.

Tips from the American Association of Orthopedic Surgeons to help make an extreme winter sports adventure safer include:

- Always wear a helmet for high-velocity sports.
- Prepare for extreme physical activity by stretching and warming up.
- Hydrate and eat a well-balanced diet.
- Wear appropriate protective gear and outerwear to limit skin exposure.
- Know when to stop. Injuries happen from exhaustion.
- Avoid overexposure to sub-freezing temperatures.
- Be informed about current weather conditions.
- Stay in bounds on the slopes and watch for obstacles and hazardous conditions.
- Never participate in winter sports activities alone.
- Extreme sports activities should be enjoyed where medical care is near.
- Seek medical attention if injured.

Kids watch extreme sporting events on television and they think flying through the air on a snowboard looks easy, says George Russell, MD, spokesperson for the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeon (AAOS). They do not see all the practice it takes to do that and they don't see how often extreme athletes get injured while learning their stunts.

If injured while participating in any extreme sport, seek diagnosis and treatment from a DOC sports medicine physician, a specialty-trained orthopedic surgeon for musculoskeletal injuries. If a mild concussion is suspected, a diagnosis may require a neurological examination to test vision, hearing, strength, sensations, balance, coordination, reflexes, memory, and a cranial CT scan or MRI. Depending on the symptoms and severity of the injury, the guest may be referred to a neurologist. Traumatic brain injuries are emergencies and require immediate treatment at the closest ER.



We do appreciate the donations. Improper use of the dumpsters costs the district and may result in a net loss.



School District of Black Hawk Student School Drop Off and Pick Up Procedure

Changes Due To Construction

As we begin the excitement of a new school year at Black Hawk and the new remodeling and additions that are being added to our school, we will need to adjust some of the changes to our drop-off and pick-up routines here at the school. Our parking lot will be completely inaccessible to students and visitors at the beginning of this school year.

- 1. We have two entrances to the school building in the morning and two exits from the building in the afternoon. Door 2 (E. Center Street) and Door 5 (N. Division Street).
- 2. The school parking lot is not accessible for entrance or parking.
- 3. Door 2 and 5 will open at 7:45 a.m. If you drop students prior to 7:50 a.m., please make this a prudent drop-off. Our buses will be pulling into E.Center Street for a 7:50 a.m. drop.
- 4. Students who drive to school must park in the gravel parking lot, west of the Meske Center, where the old baseball diamond was located.



- 5. High school students MUST park in the student parking area if driving to school. You will not be allowed to park off school grounds. School consequences will be invoked for those who do not follow this expectation, including the extreme of banishment from driving/trespassing violations for repeat offenders who refuse to follow this procedure. High school students who drive, will enter the building at Door 2.
- 6. Buses will drop off students on East Center Street at Door 2, around 7:50 a.m. Persons dropping students off at school must adhere to state and local traffic laws involving school buses. School buses have priority to East Center Street during drop off and pick up times. Please respect the amber and red lights of the school buses. Do not enter into this area when the bus lights are on and students are being dropped off and picked up. The area in front of Door 2, should be clear of buses around 7:55 a.m.
- 7. Once buses have cleared, students may be dropped off on East Center Street at Door 2.
- 8. Additionally, students may be dropped off on N. Division Street at Door 5 on the **near end (east end of the street)**, **adjacent to the school building**. We would like to avoid students having to cross the street on Division Street. We kindly ask that cars do not permanently park on N. Division Street, taking up space. We ask that individuals do a quick drop of students and then maneuver off of Division Street to make room for additional vehicles who are dropping off students.

- 9. 4K,5K, 5th and MS/HS school students will enter and exit the building at Door 2.
- 10. 1st 4th grades will enter and exit the building at Door 5.
- 11. Visitors to the school during the instructional day (8:05 a.m. 3:26 p.m.) will need to park in the gravel parking lot, or find temporary parking off of school grounds.
- 12. Families picking up students after school must NOT park in the bus area of E. Center Street in front of Doors 2 and 3. You may be allowed to temporarily park on Division Street to pick up your student(s) at Door 5. Please adhere to the village parking restrictions in front of the fire station. Fire trucks need to be able to access Division street in emergencies.
- 13. Staff are not allowed to park on Division Street or in the bus drop off area of E. Center Street. Staff will need to find parking off school grounds or in the gravel parking lot.
- 14. Small deliveries will be made at Door 5. Large deliveries will be determined.
- If there are changes to your child's bus schedule, please provide a note with your children for both their classroom teacher and the bus driver. If a permanent adjustment is needed, we will require one notification at the beginning of the school year. Otherwise, notification is required in writing every time your child needs to ride a bus to a location after school.
- The district will not adjust our bus driver's regular routes to make special stops for student drop off.
- We respectfully ask that you be sensitive to your child's peers when scheduling birthday parties, or other friend gatherings at your home. Large parties of children riding a non-scheduled bus will not be permitted. Please don't send invitations or letters with your child to hand out at school to their friends. This creates an unpleasant environment for some children, and is a major distraction to our instructional objectives of the day.
- No student will be able to ride an unscheduled bus route without a permission slip.

We greatly appreciate your assistance in providing a safe and positive atmosphere at Black Hawk Schools.

Visitors During School Day / Parent Pick-Up Procedures

- Door 5 will be the entrance to the school building during the school day. Visitors to the building will have to buzz in at Door 5 for screening. When admitted to the school building, we ask that you transition directly to the school office to sign in.
- Please do not transition directly to your child's classroom and interrupt the instructional process. Please
 do not linger in the hallways. Proceed directly to the office.
- We respectfully ask that parents/guardians please report to the office to sign your elementary child in or out of the building during instructional hours (8:05 a.m. 3:24 p.m.). MS/HS students can sign themselves out in the office and meet authorized individuals outside of the building.
- Teachers will begin getting Ech 5K students ready for bus departure and parent pick-up at 3:15 p.m. 1st grade through 5th grade students will begin preparing for bus departure and parent pick-up at 3:20 p.m.
- We ask that parents who are picking their children up from school, meet their children at the south end of the building on <u>East Center Street at Door 2</u>., and escort them to your vehicle. If picking up at Door 5, please park on the school side of the street (East), to avoid students having to cross the road.
- Be visible so your child sees you as they exit the building.
- Please avoid coming into the school to pick up your child, unless it is absolutely necessary. The purpose of this request is to avoid hallway clutter and maintain safety at the end of a school day.



SCHOOL DISTRICT OF BLACK HAWK REGULAR MEETING NOVEMBER 8, 2023

The board meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm in the Business Room by President Dee Paulson the following members were presentDee Paulson, Val Dunlavey, Mindy Stauffacher, Clayton Ruegsegger, Jason Figi, and Jim Baumgartner. ABSENT- Kerry Holland - Also present were the administration of Willy Chambers, Cory Milz, Tammy Zimmerman and AD Director Eric Erickson

Motion by Baumgartner and seconded by Stauffacher to consent to agenda. A discussion was had about the garage cost we will only be approving the \$27,342 down payment for that. A question was raised about why it was not approved by the board and this cost is covered under the \$850,000 loan. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Administration report:

Construction Stuff:

The temp fence at the front of the parking lot is up. The rest will be done next week after a few other projects are completed.

The temporary offices are ready to move into, except for the data which will be completed by TC Networks tomorrow. We will start the transition on Friday.

The power to the construction trailer is installed.

Friday and possibly Saturday, M2 will remove the main section of the blacktop on the original parking lot. They will start construction on the construction entrance either Saturday or first thing Monday.

POB will come to stake the building site on Monday and Jon Curran will be locating some of the services on Monday as well.

I am supposed to have the new construction schedule by Friday. We have a revised payout schedule as of today.

The first payment request has been submitted. The request for \$434,227.50 has been submitted. HSR will review it for verification of the scope of work that has been completed. We will then work with PMA to pay the bill assuming HSR verifies the scope.

Scott Krieg was at the village meeting on Monday to present and have the final building permit approved. Scott Jelle told Scott the permit would be in hand by the end of this week.

The schedule going forward is definitely dependent on the weather. But when I asked about the schedule related to the destruction of the old building and moving into the new spaces Scott stated they currently plan on destruction at the beginning of summer knowing that we need to occupy the new spaces for that to happen.

This coming Wednesday will be the 2nd early release day provided by the Board. Thank you.

Thank you to Dusty Williams, Rachel Wolff, Mike Powers, Kurt Ellefson, and Dee Paulson for the words of wisdom at the groundbreaking. Thank you to all of you that were able to come and support the ceremonial event. Thank you to Dee, Jim, and Jason for your efforts to plan the event.

As I noted in an email to the Board we are applying for a Stronger Connections Grant through the DPI. The survey we sent out to gather community input currently has 40 responses. The ideas that will be placed in the grant are as follows:

- 1. Provide training for staff on SEL
- 2. Continue the work we just started on staff morale.
- 3. Hire a .5 FTE counselor to work with individuals and small groups struggling with SEL/Mental Health.
- 4. Provide stipends for the SIC members when they work on these initiatives.
- 5. Parent/ Community nights to discuss mental health and parenting skills
- 6. Pay for sessions with a private psychologist, the sessions are to be held at school, for students who are struggling.

This is a grant of up to \$300,000 and covers two full years (money to be spent by September of 2026.

Green County is considering providing some funds to help with student needs in each of the districts. More to come.

Milz: Thank all of the volunteers this year who came to speak to our students for our Career Awareness Day. We had 15 total speakers representing a diversity of local careers and jobs. Thank you to Steve Herbst for serving as our headline speaker.

Thank you to the Parent's Club for their support of the middle school Fall Dance and the elementary room parties.

Juniors were administered the Pre-ACT on October 27. We use the data collected on this test to help students plan for identifying areas of academic growth.

Cathy McCauley is running a Book Fair this past week for students. Cathy should be commended for the job she does trying to find books and content that the students will enjoy reading.

We've had numerous academic field trips in November for mathematics, biology, and for anatomy/physiology; as well as for agricultural-related trips.

Julie Schulz, from Advanced Welding Institute, is coming to Black Hawk on Thursday,

November 9 to talk to the tech. ed. classes and talk about opportunities in manufacturing.

We will be hosting local veterans on Monday, November 13 at 9:00 a.m. for our Veterans Day. The program is full of music performances and oratory pieces by our students. The public is welcome.

The student pep rally for our BHW Football team will be on Thursday, Nov. 9 at 3:00 p.m. We are inviting parents but not opening it to the public due to time constraints and other activity conflicts.

The October Employee of the Month was Ms. Rebecca Neff. Ms. Neff has done a tremendous job juggling the coverage of our 1:1 students and helping organize assistance within the elementary special education department.

Shout out to our faculty, paraprofessionals, and office staff for their amazing flexibility and sense of teamwork this past month. We have many instances of not being able to find substitute teachers and aides for staff who take leave. Our staff have been so good about covering for their peers.

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
