

# Student Learning, Achievement, and Opportunities Subcommittee



#### Subcommittee Work

- Reviewed the WCPS Kentucky School Report Card and the WCPS Comprehensive District Improvement Plan (CDIP). Provided feedback on the CDIP <u>Meeting</u>

  Presentation
  - <u>Areas of Concern</u> Student Gap Groups continue to remain the same (Very Low for Students with Disabilities at all 3 levels, and Very Low for African Americans and EL plus monitored in two levels).
- Reviewed the process for adopting our district common curriculum with HMH Into Reading and Math, as well as Savvas curriculum for High School.
- Provided examples of instructional resources to the Instructional Department that target Gap Groups, marginalized students, and schools with high-risk populations.

# Equitable Discipline Subcommittee & Hiring and Recruiting Subcommittee



#### Equitable Discipline Subcommittee


- Reviewed and presented on PBIS and Tableau, a data analysis platform that has an equity dashboard for underrepresented students in multiple domains like in-school/out-of-school suspensions, GT, Sped, AP participation, etc.
- Reviewed the district behavior matrix and discussed discipline referral process.

#### Hiring and Recruiting Subcommittee

- Outlined the process for applying for jobs, requirements for classified and certified, and the expanding alternative routes to teaching.
- Discussed the need, not just in recruitment, but also the mentoring of minority teachers for better support and retention.
- Detailed the efforts being made to recruit teachers and support staff.





#### **Subcommittee Work**

- Coordinated the 9th annual WCPS Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration in January 2023.
  - Highlighted by the district choir and student-centered performances.
  - Awarded six students with prizes and scholarships for placing in the art and essay competition.
- Applied for a Kentucky Historical Marker to honor the three Rosenwald segregated schools of WCPS.
- Exploring other ways to honor those schools for the upcoming school year.





- Added three Gifted and Talented teachers to expand services for elementary students.
- Expanded Preschool to 4-days-per-week across WCPS.
- Begun implementing ELLevation Strategies resources to strengthen EL scaffolds in classroom instruction across the district.
- Transitioned to Fastbridge for Academic and Behavior Screening.
- Healthy Kids Clinic- Every WCPS School has an RN or LPN and each feeder system has a Nurse Practitioner.
- WKU Game Changers Program and Job Recruitment throughout GRREC region, Kentucky, and beyond.
- Will be participating in Cohort 3 of the Kentucky Equity Playbook during 23-24.

## Closing Remarks



There is mounting pressure from outside groups and lawmakers to censor and ban content, to put negative connotations to the word's diversity and equity, and to divide our students and educators.
