Minneapolis Public Schools Elementary Student Behavior Agreement

One important way to create a school that feels safe, welcoming and supportive for all students, staff and families is to have expectations we agree on. When we do this together, all members of our community are able to learn, contribute and be treated with kindness and respect.

Here are some of the behaviors that will help you be successful at school:

- Come to school every day, on time, ready to learn
- Treat yourself and others with respect
- Follow school and classroom rules and agreements
- Work to learn at your best ability

- Talk to your family about what is happening in school
- Handle all school materials and property with care

Note: Personal electronic devices like smartphones, are only allowed at school if your caregiver has an agreement with your school administrator.

There are some things you cannot do at school.

If you do these things you may be suspended. Remember to follow all rules and agreements at school, on the bus, bus stop and on field trips.

- Physically harming or threatening to hurt another person
- Fighting with another student
- Harassing or bullying others
- Using school property without permission
- Damaging school property

- Going out of the bus emergency door without permission
- Stealing from others
- Pulling a fire alarm falsely
- Bringing medicine from home and not bringing it to the Health Office

I understand that the following misbehavior WILL result in suspension and may result in a recommendation for expulsion:

- Fighting which ends in a serious injury
- Having drugs or alcohol at school with idea of giving or selling to others
- Setting a fire on purpose
- Robbing or threatening to harm other student
- Harassing, bullying or assaulting another
- Having drugs or alcohol at school with the idea of giving or selling them to others.

• Having a gun, knife or other item that can be used to harm others.

Note: A student who finds a weapon on the way to school or in the school building, or who accidentally brings it to school and who reports it to school staff immediately shall NOT be considered in possession of a weapon.
