NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN of the intention of the Board of Trustees of the Santa Barbara Unified School District ("District") to consider entering into an energy services contract ("Agreement") with Horizon Mechanical Inc., pursuant to which Horizon Mechanical Inc. will install a pair of condensing natural gas powered pool boilers at San Marcos High School, all pursuant to the terms of Government Code section 4217.12. The Board of Trustees will consider for approval a resolution formally adopting findings required by Government Code section 4217.10 *et seq.*, regarding anticipated energy cost savings and other benefits from entering into an Energy Services Agreement with Horizon Mechanical Inc.. The anticipated findings the Board will consider and adopt by Resolution are: The anticipated cost to the District for thermal or electric energy or conservation services provided by Horizon Mechanical Inc. will be less than the anticipated marginal cost to the District of thermal, electrical, or other energy that would have been consumed by the District in the absence of the proposed purchases.

The time and place set for the public hearing on the proposed Resolution and intention of the Board of Trustees of Santa Barbara Unified School District to consider entering into the Agreement is Tuesday, January 30, 2024, at 6:00 pm or as soon thereafter as practicable, 720 Santa Barbara Street, Santa Barbara. At such time the testimony of all interested persons for or against the proposed Agreement will be heard. Any protest pertaining to the regularity or sufficiency of the proceedings shall be in writing and shall clearly set forth the irregularities and defects to which the objection is made. Any written protest shall be filed with the Clerk of the Board on or before the time set for the hearing. The District may waive any irregularities in the form or content of any written notice and at the hearing may correct minor defects in the proceedings. Written protests may be withdrawn, in writing, at any time before the conclusion of the hearing.
