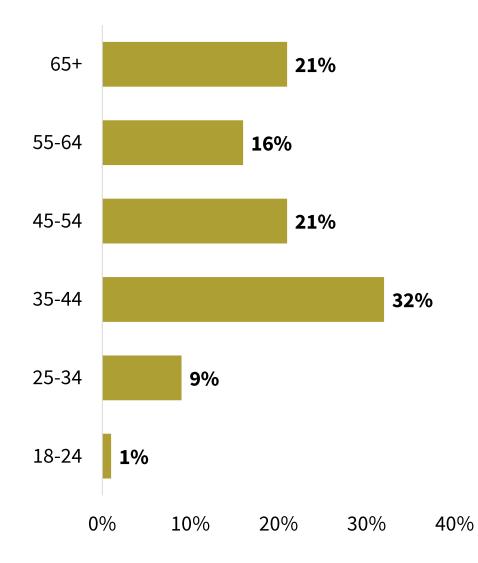

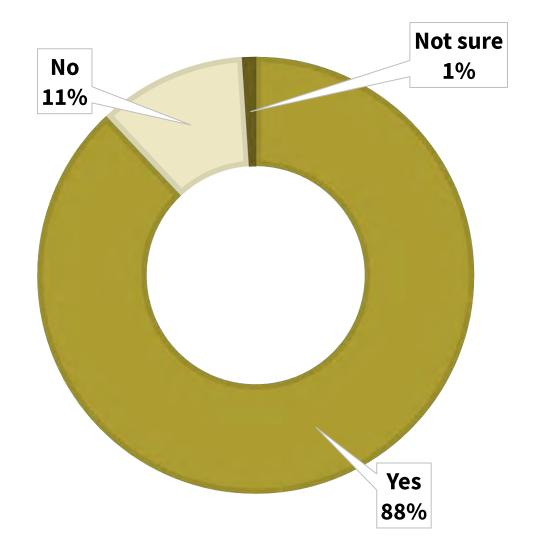

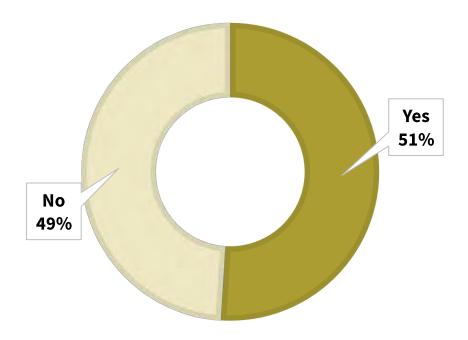

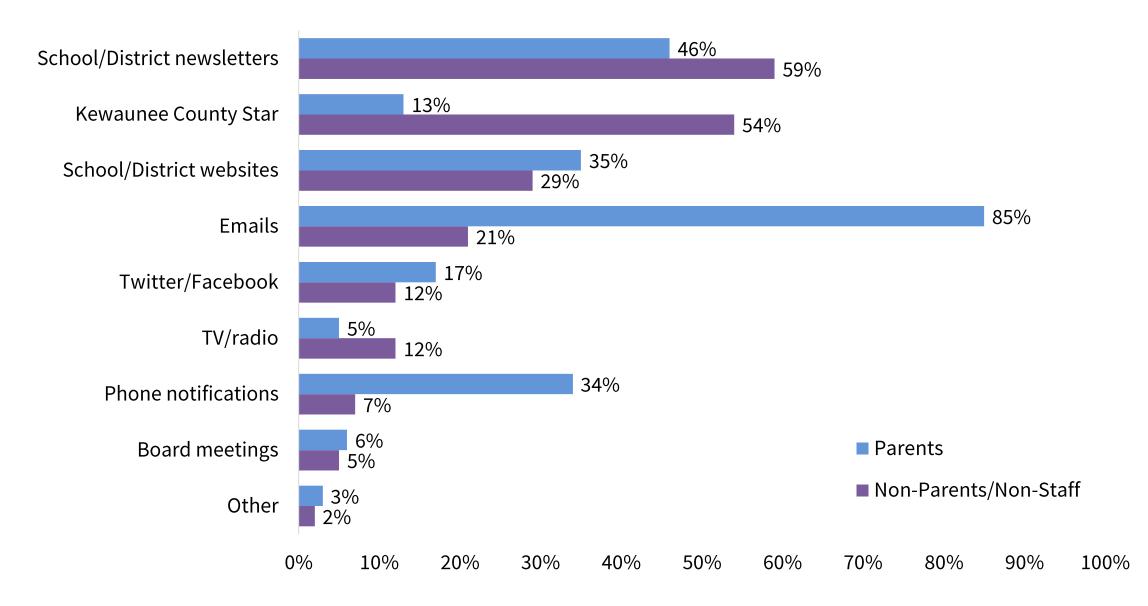
Do you have children attending a school in the District?

Financial Information

One of the most significant challenges facing the Luxemburg-Casco community is the lack of predictable, sustainable funding for rural school districts like ours.

Since 1993, the State of Wisconsin has limited the revenue a school district can receive. Based on the most recent data available, our revenue limit is near the bottom of our conference.

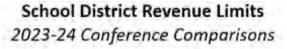
The mill rate (which is used to calculate a school district's share of local property taxes) has declined by 24% over the last six years.

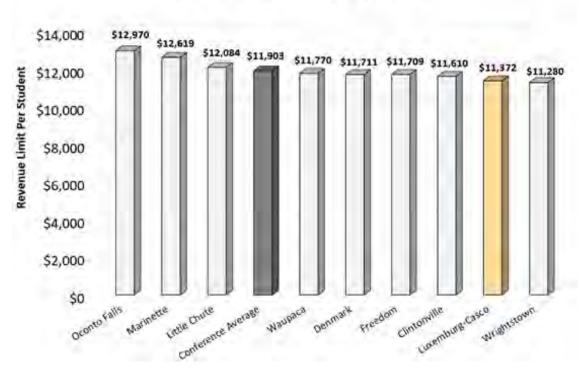




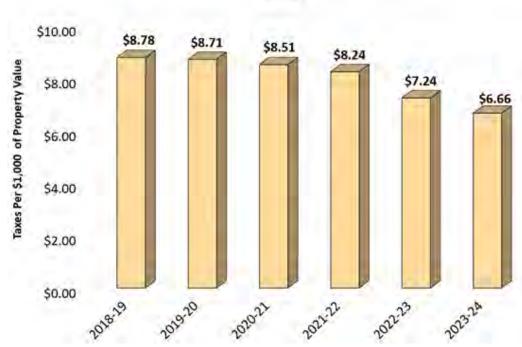

Financial Information (cont'd)

Even with the recently approved budget, state funding has not kept up with increasing costs for such things as transportation/fuel, utilities, staff compensation, insurance, technology, and special education services.

To help balance our budget, over the past year, the District deferred maintenance projects, postponed the replacement of classroom equipment, and reduced or eliminated staff hours and positions.





Referendum Funding Options

Local voters can approve two types of referendums to provide their schools with additional funding.

- 1. A <u>capital (facilities) referendum</u> allows a district to take out a loan (issue debt) to pay for major facility improvements. *Luxemburg-Casco voters approved this type of referendum in 2018 to improve security, move the middle school, and build the gym.*
- 2. An <u>operational referendum</u> asks voters to approve additional funding above the state-imposed revenue limit. The funding pays for expenses like student programming, staff compensation, and maintenance. Over the past 30 years, 85% of Wisconsin school districts have pursued this type of referendum, but Luxemburg-Casco has not.





Operational Referendum Funding

The District has developed two operational referendum options for community feedback.

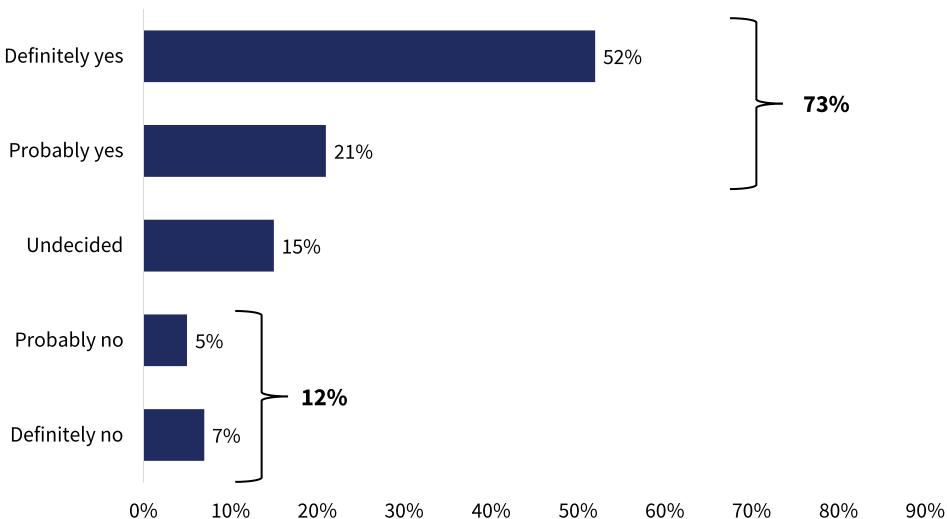
<u>Base Plan:</u> If voters support a referendum that provides \$2.6 million each year for three years, the District would be able to maintain student programs, services, and building maintenance.

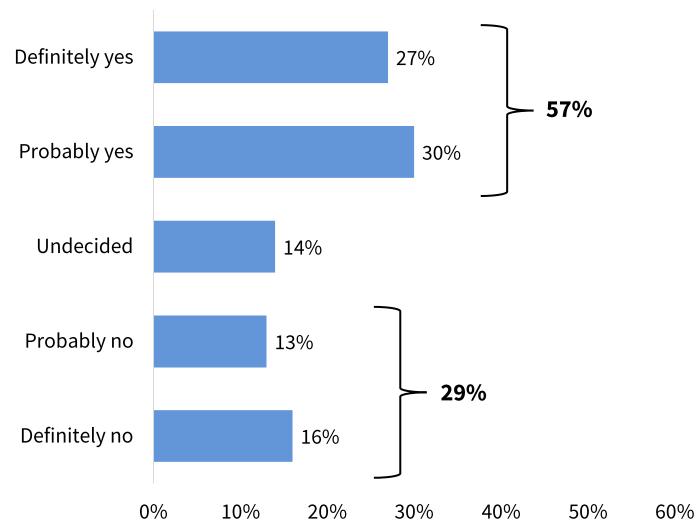
Would you support a referendum that provides \$2.6 million each year for three years to maintain programs, services, and building maintenance?

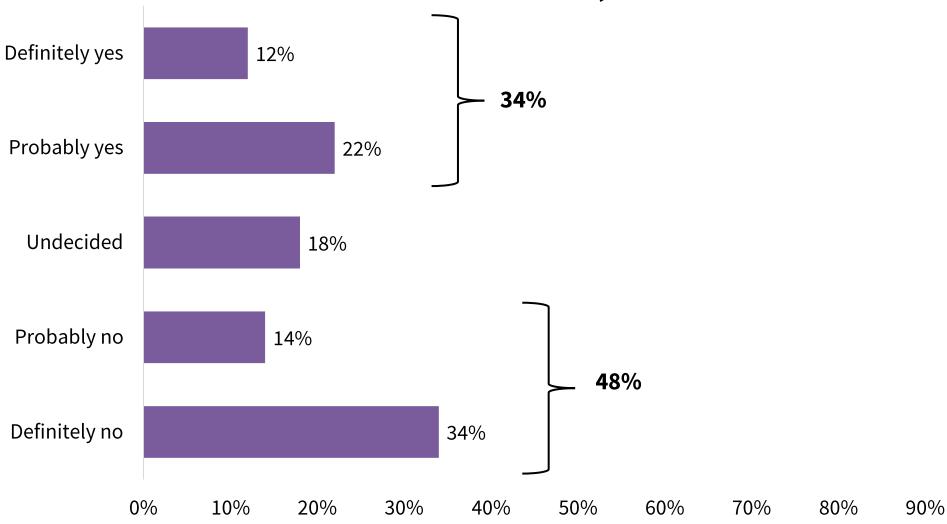






Would you support a referendum that provides \$2.6 million each year for three years to maintain programs, services, and building maintenance?

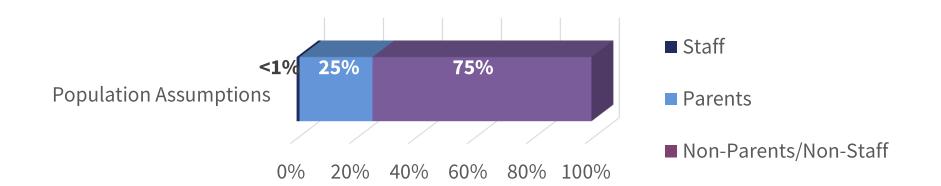

Weighted support for *Definitely yes and Probably yes:*

$$0.25 (57\%) + 0.75 (34\%) = 39.8\%$$





Operational Referendum Funding

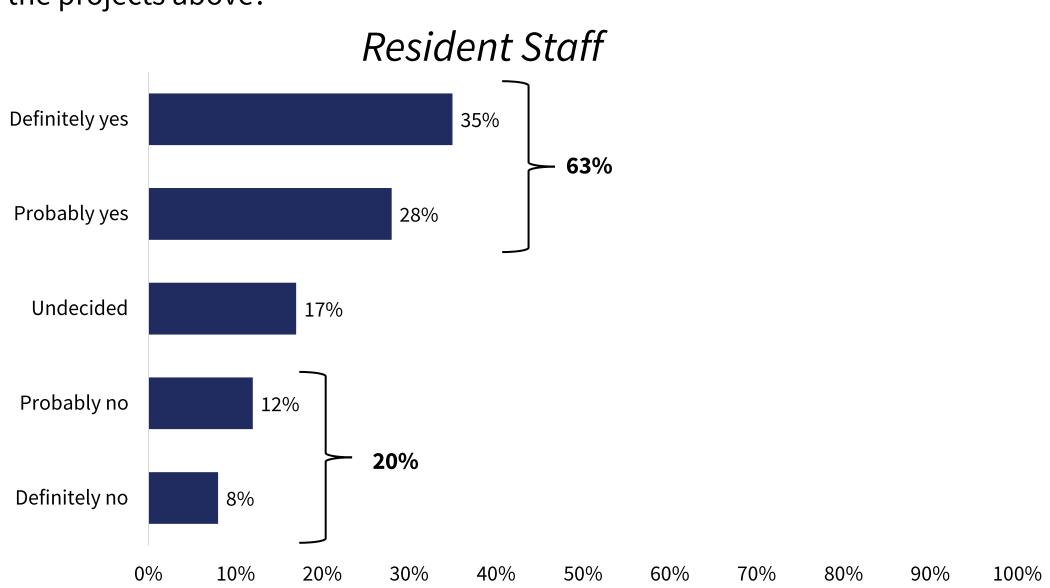
<u>Base Plan + Additional Projects</u>: If voters support a referendum that provides \$3.01 million each year for three years, the District would also be able to:

- ✓ Repair leaking roof sections and replace worn-out bleachers at the middle school.
- ✓ Replace outdated/failing technology (switches, servers, smartboards, etc.).
- ✓ Update curriculum and improve teacher training.
- ✓ Modify traffic flow to improve pedestrian safety.





Would you support <u>expanding</u> the referendum to \$3.01 million to pay for the projects above?







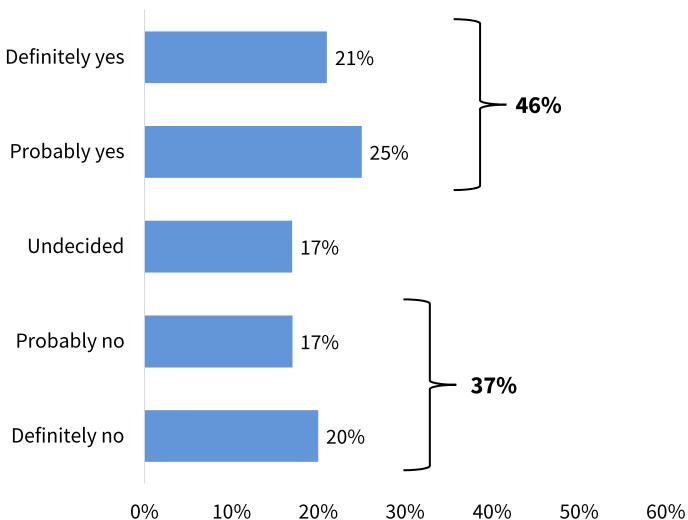
Would you support <u>expanding</u> the referendum to \$3.01 million to pay for the projects above?

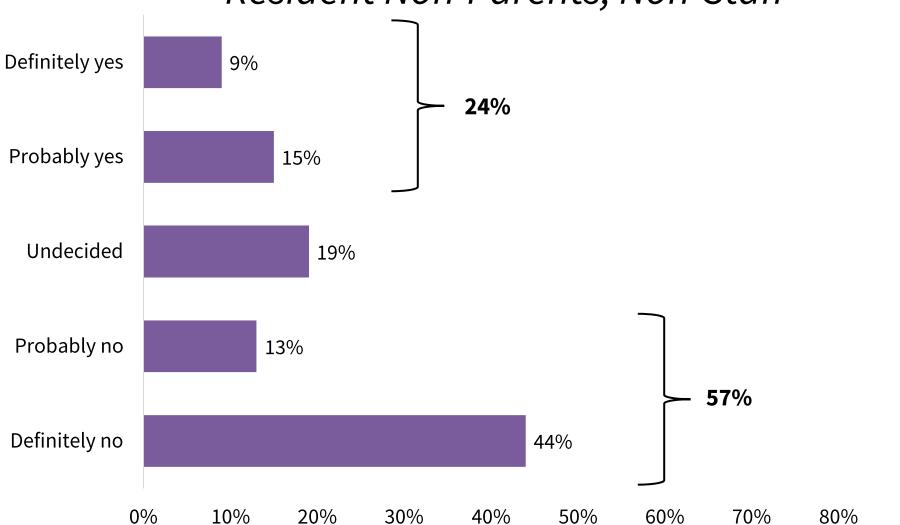






Would you support <u>expanding</u> the referendum to \$3.01 million to pay for the projects above?





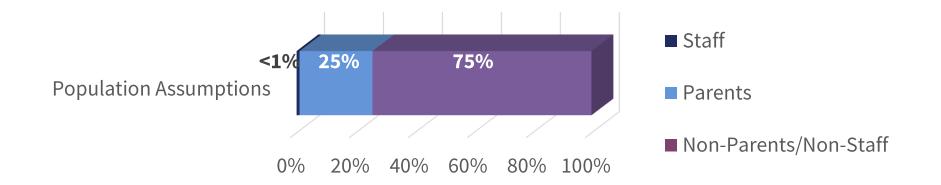

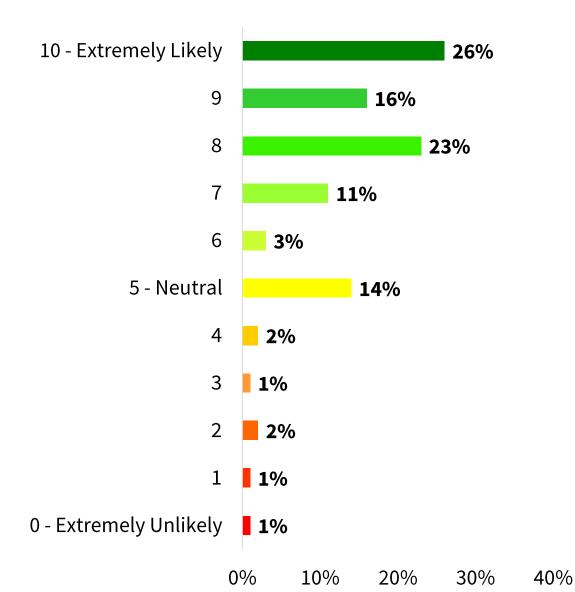

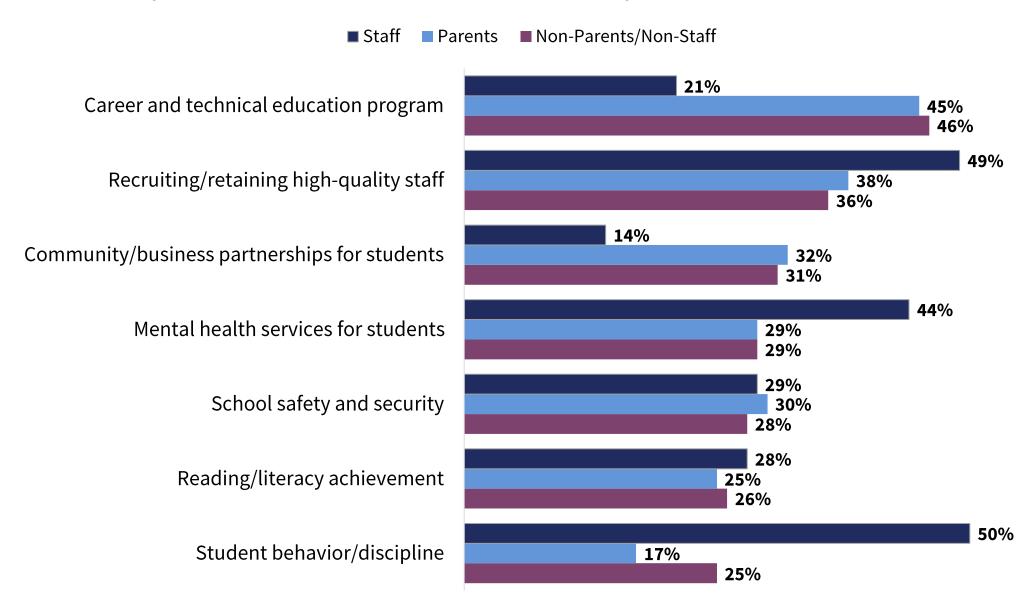

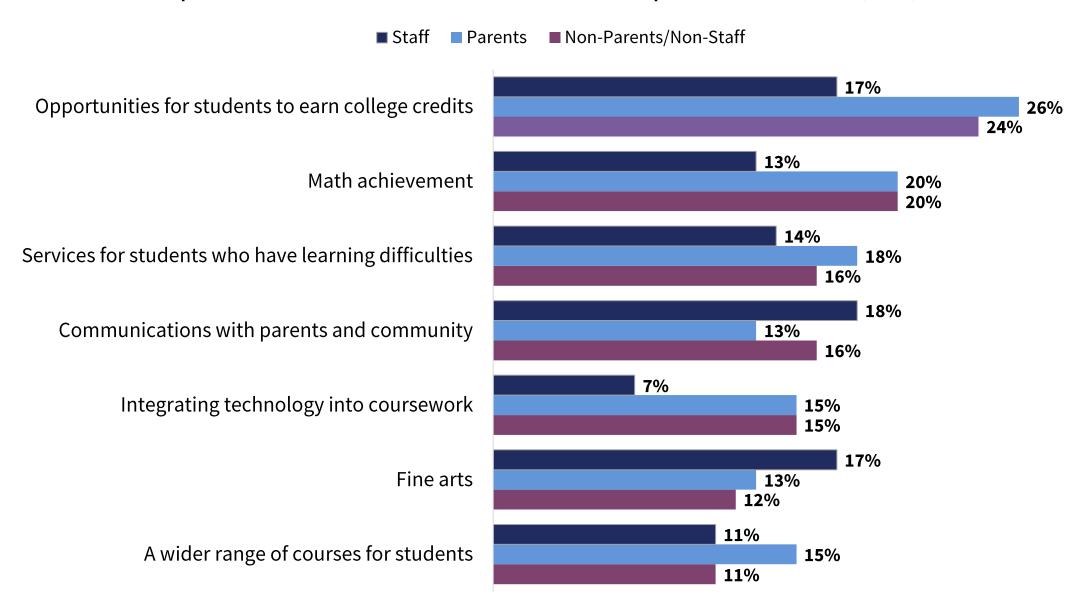
Future Planning: Over the next five years, where do you believe we should focus our improvement efforts? Please choose up to four areas. (1/3)







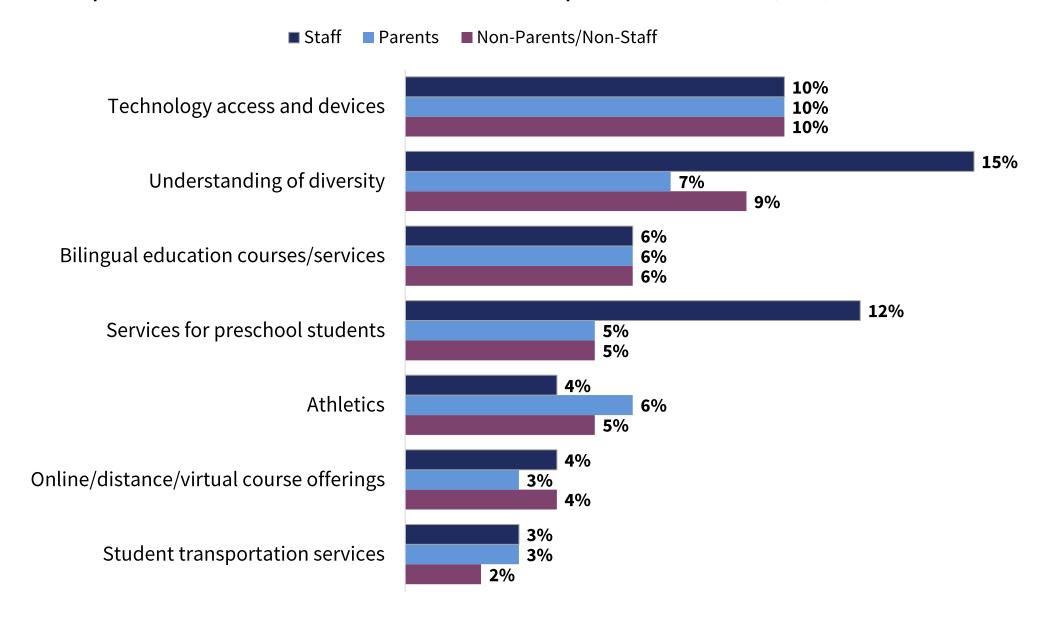
Future Planning: Over the next five years, where do you believe we should focus our improvement efforts? Please choose up to four areas. (2/3)
