

Title: Student-Operated Devices and Vehicles

The principal of each building shall establish and publish regulations concerning the riding, handling, location and storage of bicycles, skateboards, roller blades and other student-propelled devices on school property.

In order to park a motorized vehicle on school property, students shall obtain and display a parking permit which may be transferred among vehicles in the same family with notification to the school office. Any other transfer of a parking permit shall be cause for revocation of parking privileges. Parking permits shall require a non-refundable fee as set by the Board. Parking permits shall only be issued upon completion of an application including a copy of driver's license, registration and proof of insurance. A parking permit does not guarantee a parking spot.

Students are expected to drive safely and courteously and park in the assigned location. At no time should the speed of the vehicle exceed 15 MPH while on District property. At no time may a vehicle be used to skip classes or engage in any violation of the Code of Conduct.

The Board shall establish procedures for the determination of controversies in connection with the imposition of penalties. The procedures must require giving notice of the violation and the penalty prescribed and providing the opportunity for an administrative hearing.

The District's Code of Conduct is in effect anytime a student is on District property, including parking lots.

Students may not loiter around or be in their vehicle during the school day or when there is no longer a legitimate reason for them to be there on school premises. Students who drive shall enter and leave the parking lot by the routes designated.

If a student violates these regulations at a school facility other than their home high school, the home high school administrator shall be responsible for enforcement upon notice of the violation.
