

Review Admissions Criteria

General Admission Criteria

All applicants must be 18 years of age prior to program start date. Prospective students must abide by the following admission criteria to be admitted to the program:

- Completed application packet submitted no later than the published application deadline.
- Ability to meet essential program requirements and satisfactory preadmission test results.
- Satisfactory criminal check and urine drug screen.
- Previous employment (Current or past employees of Riverside Health System will be evaluated for job performance and eligibility for rehire. Adverse references from previous employers will be evaluated in the admission process and may result in non-acceptance to the program. Riverside Health System employees (in good standing) are awarded additional points toward admission).
- Official High School transcript or GED certificate (The applicant must be a graduate of an accredited high school or have earned a high school equivalency (GED) certificate with a HS GPA of 2.0. Evidence, such as a high school transcript, must include the name of the high school attended city, state, graduation year and that the high school or program was approved by the applicable governing or state authority).
- Official College transcripts from all schools attended regardless of prerequisite completed courses.
- Immigration or citizenship documentation is required if the applicant is not a U.S. citizen by birth (The College is not Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) certified and cannot accept international students on an F-1 or M-1 visa).
- If English is an applicant's 2nd language, a TOEFL score of 550 (paper) or 79 (internet based) is required (Test must have been completed within the last 2 years).

Individual Program Admission Criteria

Pre-Nursing or Pre-Allied Health Track

To provide ease of access to pre- and corequisite general education courses, RCHC has entered into an agreement with Geneva College / Portage Learning. Prospective students interested in acceptance into RCHC degree and certificate programs of study may first apply for our online Pre-Nursing or Pre-Allied Health courses to complete prerequisite program coursework.

High School Seniors are eligible to apply.

Nurse Aide

The 6-week Nurse Aide program is designed to prepare students to become Certified Nursing Assistants.

Prerequisite College Courses/Credits:

Pre-Admission Testing Requirements: ATI TEAS Required Score: 50% or higher

The ATI - TEAS Exam is required with a minimum score of 50% to enroll in Pre-Nursing or Pre-Allied Health courses. Students scoring between 50-70% will be automatically enrolled in the ATI Launch: Academic Readiness program. If enrolled, satisfactory completion of the ATI Launch program is required as part of the application process for a core program (Professional Nursing, Physical Therapist Assistant, Radiologic Technology, Respiratory Care, or Surgical Technology.) The ATI Launch program is optional for students with an initial TEAS score above 70%.

Practical Nursing

The one-year Practical Nursing program leads to a Diploma in Practical; graduates are eligible for licensure examinations to become an LPN in Virginia.

Recommendations:

Average Accepted GPA: 2.96

LPN-to-RN Advanced Placement

Riverside College of Health Careers offers an advanced placement option for current licensed practical nurses who are looking to become registered nurses. This option allows the LPN to advance place into the Professional Nursing Program by entering as a level two student.

Students must be licensed to practice in a licensure compact state.

Applicant has been employed as an LPN for at least one year since being licensed, with no more than five years since their last work experience.

Recommendations:

Cumulative College-level GPA of 3.0 or better is recommended due to the competitive nature of admissions.

Average Accepted GPA: 3.26

Documentation of previous healthcare experience (including volunteer hours) is recommended.

Professional Nursing

The two-year Professional Nursing program leads to an Associate of Applied Science Degree. Upon completion of the program, graduates are eligible to apply to sit for the NCLEX-RN© (National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses).

Recommendations:

Cumulative College-level GPA of 3.0 or better is recommended due to the competitive nature of admissions.

Average Accepted GPA: 3.26

Documentation of previous healthcare experience (including volunteer hours) is optional.

Review Admissions Criteria

RN-to-BSN

Applicants must have earned an associate degree in Professional Nursing (ADN, AAS, AOS) or a Diploma in Professional Nursing, and hold a current, unencumbered license to practice as a Registered Nurse in Virginia (or Compact State).

Applicants may be considered for Concurrent Enrollment in the RN-to-BSN Program if currently enrolled and in good standing in an affiliated Professional Nursing associate degree program (successful completion of the associate degree and successful NCLEX-RN required to be eligible for conferment of the BSN regardless of courses achieved).

Radiologic Technology

The Radiologic Technology Program is a two-year Allied Health program that leads to an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Radiologic Technology.

Recommendations:

Cumulative College-level GPA of 3.0 or better is recommended due to the competitive nature of admissions.

Average Accepted GPA: 3.46

Documentation of previous healthcare experience (including volunteer hours) is optional.

Cardiovascular Technology

A one-year certificate program that allows applicants to choose between Adult Echocardiography Specialty (ECHO) and Vascular Non-Invasive Specialty.

The applicant must hold a minimum of an Associate degree. Completion of a health-related program with evidence of certification or licensure, as applicable, that is active within the last five years (current active certification or licensure is not required). Students currently enrolled in a health-related program may submit an application provided they are in good standing and expected to graduate before the first scheduled day of the Cardiovascular Program.

Surgical Technology

The Surgical Technology Program is a two-year Allied Health program that leads to an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Surgical Technology.

Recommendations:

Cumulative College-level GPA of 3.0 or better is recommended due to the competitive nature of admissions.

Average Accepted GPA: 3.14

Documentation of previous healthcare experience (including volunteer hours) is optional.

Physical Therapist Assistant

The two-year Physical Therapist Assistant Program prepares students to work alongside Physical Therapy professionals and leads to an Associates of Applied Science Degree in Physical Therapist Assistant.

Recommendations:

Cumulative College-level GPA of 3.0 or better is recommended due to the competitive nature of admissions.

Average Accepted GPA: 3.34

Respiratory Care is a two-year Bachelor pogram designed to graduate professional, knowledgeable and competent entry-level respiratory therapists who are prepared to challenge the National Board for Respiratory Care (NBRC) examination to become a registered respiratory therapist and gain employment in the field.

Recommendations:

Cumulative College-level GPA of 2.5 or better is recommended due to the competitive nature of admissions.

Documentation of previous healthcare experience (including volunteer hours) is optional.

Please Note: The ATI TEAS Test is NOT required for RN-to-BSN, Cardiovascular Technology, Respiratory Care and Nurse Aide
