

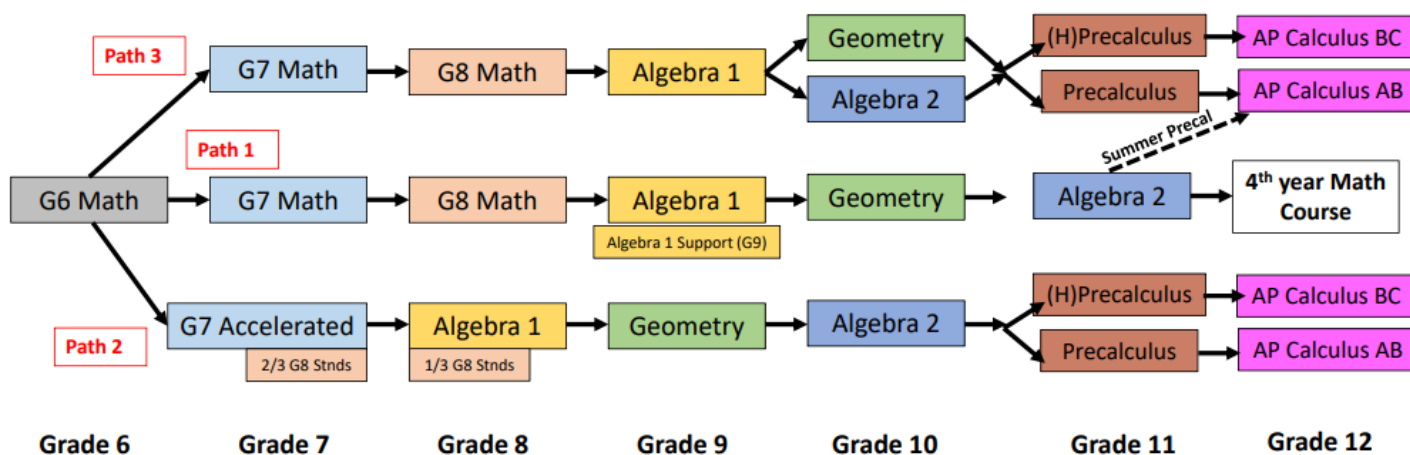
# Secondary Math Placement

High School / Middle School

Placement in appropriate math courses is critical for students during middle and high school. Senate Bill 359, the California Mathematics Placement Act of 2015, mandates districts to adopt a math placement policy for students entering ninth grade. Proper placement in the sequence of math courses reduces barriers to learning as well as ensures that students are competitive for college admissions, including admissions to the California State Universities (CSU) and University of California (UC) college. CSU and UC systems recommend that students take a rigorous math course (pre-calculus or higher) during their senior year.

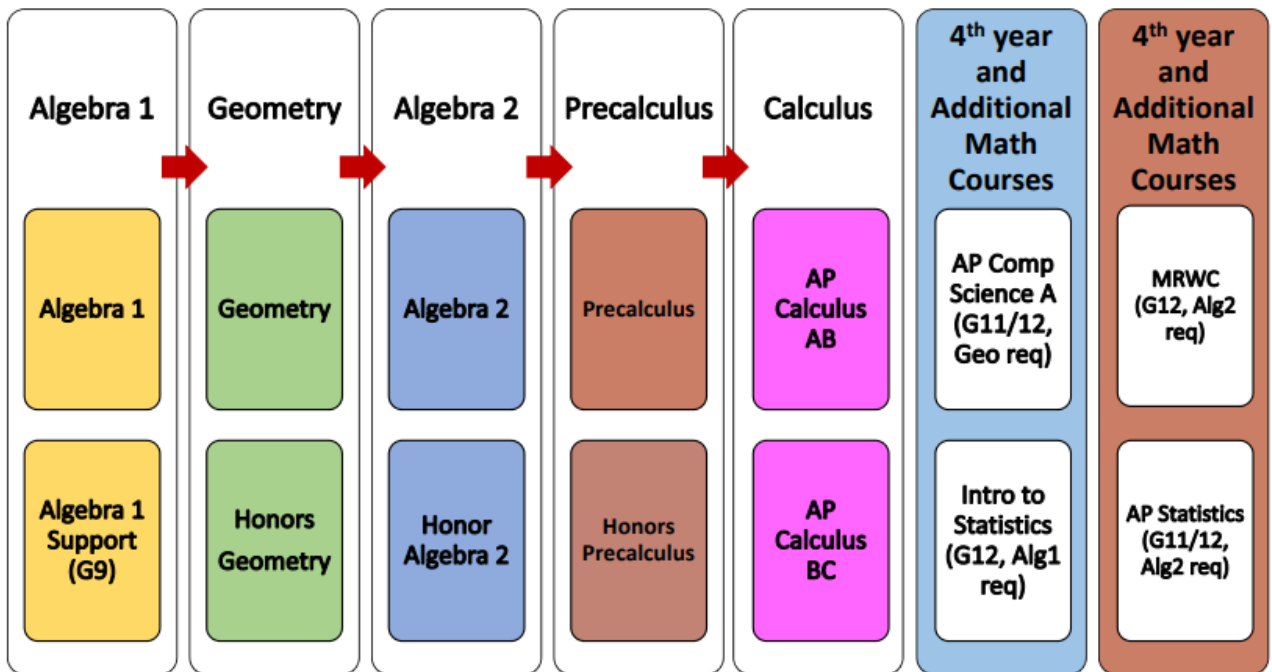
