CAMHS Getting Help/ Mental Health Support Team in Slough



Who we are? We work for the Getting Help/ Mental Health Support Team in Slough. We are employed by the NHS and we work with several primary and secondary schools in Slough to support students, parents/carers and school staff with mental health. We work closely with Colnbrook and have provided workshops/trainings on different topics about mental health. Our team consists of a team lead, senior mental health practitioners and clinical supervisors, qualified Education Mental Health Practitioners, an assistant psychologist and administrators.

What family support do we offer? We are an early intervention team aiming at supporting children and young people aged between 5 to 18 years old with common mental health difficulties such as anxiety, fears, low mood and behavioural difficulties. We can offer parent-led interventions on managing worries, anxiety, phobias and behavioural difficulties for children aged 5-12 years old. We can also offer individual interventions to older children between 11 to 12 years old.
