





If SC-Ready was assessed today (Winter MAP Projections):



#### **Weekly Graduation Rate Report**








# **DreamBox Impact District Summary**






# Student Logins by Building - Elementary November



- 98% of students logged in at least once in Nov.
- All schools were at 95% or higher
  - Academy for success 14%
- Averaging 5.34 lessons per week
- Averaging 68 min per week

- 69% of students logged in at least once
- Three schools are at 86% or higher
- Averaging 2.49 lessons per week
- Averaging 38 min per week
- Grade 6 76%
- Grade 7 65%
- Grade 8 53%



## **Professional Development**



Teachers and administrators receive professional development opportunities for DreamBox implementation and supporting student growth. This support includes, but is not limited to:
