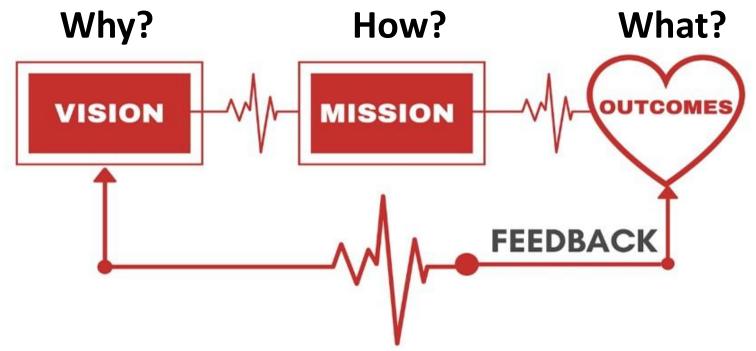

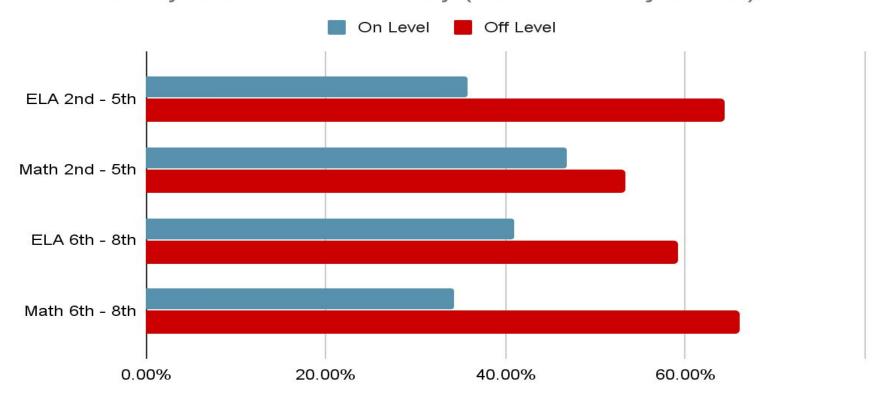

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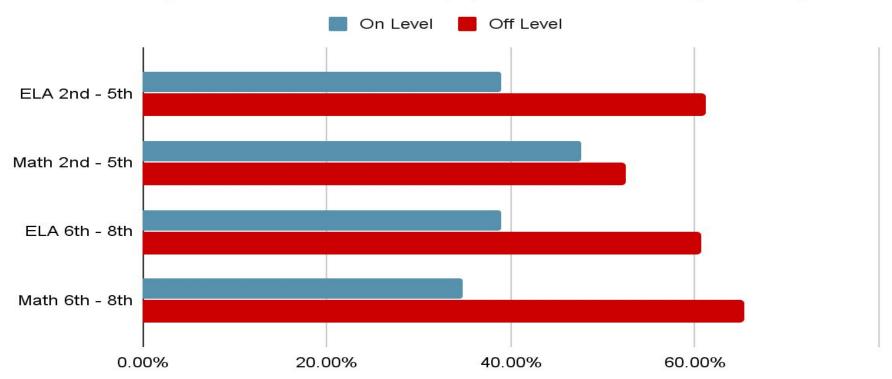

If SC-Ready was assessed today (Fall MAP Projections):



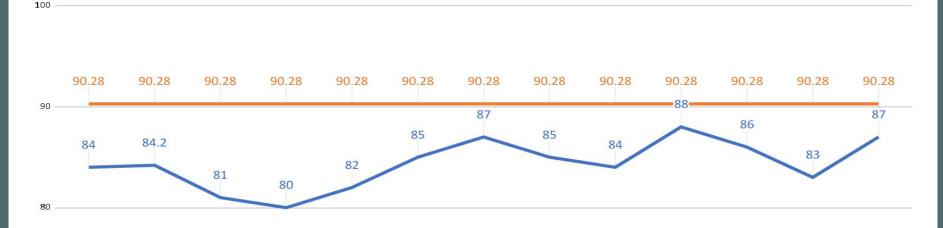

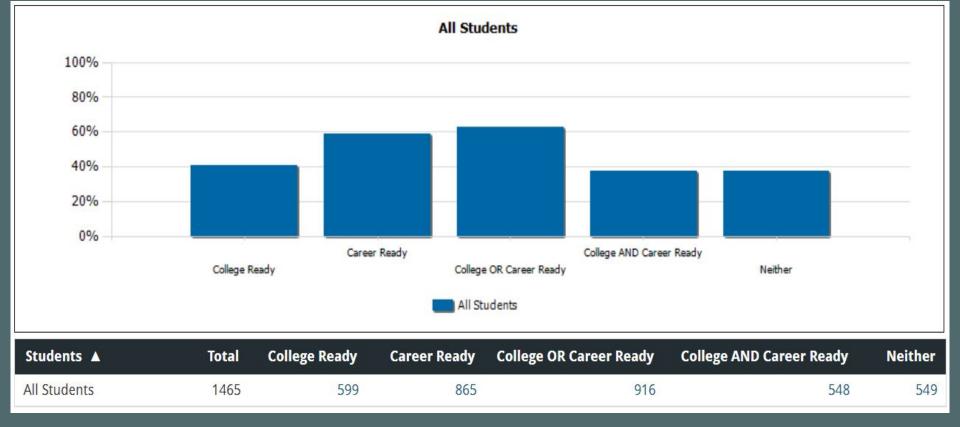
