





If SC-Ready was assessed today (Fall MAP Projections):




### Focused on Growth (Winter Update)

If SC-Ready was assessed today (Winter MAP Projections):









#### **Student Achievement Goal**










## Distribution of In-Person Enrollment (2013 - 135th day report)



## Distribution of In-Person Enrollment (2023 - 135th day report)




