



# Kindergarten

Open to children born on or before Sept. 1, 2019.

Full-day programs.

18 elementary schools throughout Simi Valley, plus Monte Vista School, our independent study school.

Every Kindergarten class offers the same curriculum, based on the California State Standards for Kindergarten.

All Kindergarten teachers are provided the same curriculum materials, supplied by the SVUSD.







If you're enrolling your child in your **neighborhood school**, you can submit the enrollment forms at that school site beginning **February 12**, **2024**.

If you're considering submitting a **School of Choice** online application, the window to submit is from now until **February 9.**

Teachers often use a centers-based approach to instruction that allows our students to better explore materials, practice skills and work cooperatively with their peers.











## Technology

Devices in every classroom for every student. These are used for reading, research, educational activities and instruction.

Classrooms equipped with interactive white boards and special audio devices to enhance teachers' voices so students hear better.

Teachers receive special professional development for using classroom tech as a supplemental teaching tool.

# Dual Language Immersion (DLI)

SVUSD will open its first DLI program, called the Dual Language Academy, at Arroyo Elementary School in the 2024-2025 school year

**Two-way dual language immersion** is language learning and academic instruction for native speakers of English and native speakers of another language, Spanish in this case. The goal of a DLI program is proficiency and academic achievement in both languages as well as cross-cultural understanding.

- 70/30 in 2nd
- 60/40 in 3rd
  50/50 in 4th and 5th







### **Enrollment Requirements**

# **Documents Needed Before Kindergarten**

Clear copy of certified birth certificate

Copy of proof of residency (utility bill, lease agreement, mortgage deed).

Copy of immunization records

A *Report of Health Examination* form completed by physician (no earlier than 6 months before start of Kindergarten)





# Immunizations

**Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis (DTaP, DTP, Tdap, or Td):** 5 doses (4 doses OK if one was given on or after 4th birthday. 3 doses OK if one was given on or after 7th birthday.)

**Polio (OPV or IPV):** 4 doses (3 doses OK if one was given on or after 4th birthday)

Hepatitis B: 3 doses

Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR): 2 doses (Both given on or after 1st birthday)

#### Varicella (Chickenpox): 2 doses

These immunization requirements apply to new admissions and transfers for all grades, including TK.

An Oral Health Assessment form completed by your dentist. The assessment can be done up to one year before the start of Kindergarten or by May 31 of the Kindergarten year.

### **Additional Information**

#### **Before- and After-School Care**

Three organizations operate care services: YMCA, Rancho Simi Recreation & Parks District and the Boys & Girls Club of Moorpark & Simi Valley.

Many schools have care on-site through one of these organizations.




