Charter schools are public schools



Charter schools are cost-free and serve diverse student populations

Charter schools have flexibility in filling community needs for innovative or thematic options



Charter schools are held accountable to performance standards and education laws



What are the similarities and differences between traditional public schools and public charter schools?

#### **Similarities**

- Both are responsible for teaching approved state curriculum and adminstering state testing
- Both can not consider gender, race, ethnicity, or religion in the admissions process

#### **Differences**

- Charter schools are allowed to set an innovative programmatic vision and allocate their budget with oversight from a local board
- Charter schools must be approved for renewal every five years
