
Spotlight on Work-Based Learning

Work-Based Learning is sustained interactions with industry or community professionals in a real worksite environment. WBL offers students a chance to enhance their knowledge, technical skills, and soft skills by participating in supervised experiences that are not possible to replicate inside the classroom walls and help students prepare for their future career. Students can earn course credit for WBL (listed as Service Learning in the course catalog). The following requirements must be met to earn WBL course credit:

- -Students must complete at least 40 hours at their placement
- -Students must choose a placement which aligns with their career cluster
- --Students must have completed a course aligned with their career cluster prior to WBL
- -Students must submit evaluation from their supervisors each quarter

Assessment	Date	Grade Level Tested
ACT (College Entrance Exam)	March 26	11th*
ASVAB (Aptitude-Based Career Assessment)	March 27	10th (all)
WIN (SC Career Readiness Assessment)	March 2- 5	11th (and any Senior who has not taken it during their Junior year)
SAT (College Entrance Exam)	April 9	11th*

^{*}The SAT/ACT are optional. Juniors may choose to take either the ACT or the SAT for free on a school day.
