#### Talk Sup Week 17 Review and Preview

Good morning Sayreville. I hope you had a relaxing and enjoyable weekend. Welcome to another edition of Talk Sup, my weekly newsletter. Please remember that we will **dismiss** <u>students early today</u>. Likewise, please also remember that **schools will be** <u>closed</u> **next Monday**, **January 15**<sup>th</sup> in observance of Martin Luther King Day, and that we will dismiss students early every day that week (**Tuesday**, **January 16**<sup>th</sup> **through Friday**, **January 19**<sup>th</sup>) so that our faculty can participate in afternoon and evening **Parent/Teacher Conferences**.



While we secretly wish that we will not have to exercise any hazardous weatherrelated school closures or schedule changes (delayed opening or early dismissal) this year, the weekend storm was a good reminder that we are now in the middle of winter. Therefore, below please find some tips to prepare you for such just in case:

- Have contingency plans in place for childcare if schools are closed for the day or on a delayed opening or early dismissal schedule.
- Have a secondary plan in place in case roads between your home and the school or your workplace are closed.
- Ensure that you have emergency contact information for family members, friends, or neighbors who might need to assist you in case of an emergency.



Likewise, below please find some very important winter busing safety tips for our students and their parents.

- Arrive early at the bus stop and dress appropriately for the weather (heavy jackets, hats, mittens, gloves or boots!)
- Students should wait for the bus several feet further back off the road in a safe place, as the roads can be slippery.
- Use the handrail when boarding and exiting the bus to prevent slips and falls on icy steps.
- Before crossing in front of the bus, wait for an "all clear" from the driver. Cross 10 feet in front of the bus so the driver can see you as you cross.

Among other motions, on the Vision 2030 Finance and Infrastructure portion of the agenda, the BOE approved a contract with Imagine Learning, Inc. for tutoring services from January 3, 2024 through August 31, 2024 based on their response to the Request for Proposals for Tutoring Services opened on December 13, 2023. On the Personnel portion of the agenda, as well as other motions, the Board of Education approved several Title I Parent Family Engagement stipend positions.
