





Reading Performance: All Students






Science Performance: All Students




2022 Fall Membership By Subgroup: Racial and Ethnic Groups

















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

Short-Term Suspensions: 2022-2023




Long-Term Suspensions




Free and Reduced Meal Eligibility

Free and Reduced Breakfast Participation of Eligible Students


Free and Reduced Breakfast Participation of Eligible Students : 2022-2023


