Pursuant to the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Committee on Finance and Administration recommends the following resolutions:

F-1. APPROVAL OF BUDGET FOR THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR

The Board of Education of Hawthorne hereby adopts the following budget for the 2022-2023 school year:

The proposed budget includes sufficient funds to provide curriculum and instruction which will enable all students to achieve the core Curriculum Content Standards, and is in compliance with N.J.S.A. 18A and N.J.A.C. Title 6 and 6A.

Included in the budget is the use of \$281,932 of Banked Cap. The Banked Cap is to help support the following costs: \$146,000 for new Chrome books and cases, \$63,515 for full time high school behavioral teacher, and \$72,417 toward the cost of additional required transportation. The implementation of these programs will be completed by the end of the budget year and will not be deferred or incrementally completed over a longer period of time.

Be it further resolved, that the district's general tax requirements to support the proposed 2022-2023 budget, as stipulated by the Hawthorne Board of Education Finance

Committee and Hawthorne Borough Municipal Officials, as follows:

General Fund:	\$41,167,645
Debt Service:	<u>1,325,515</u>

F-2. APPROVAL OF WITHDRAWAL FROM CAPITAL RESERVE

Be it Resolved, that the Hawthorne Board of Education approves the withdrawal of \$200,000 from Capital Reserve to fund \$200,000 for the local share of parking lot repaving projects at the Hawthorne High School and Jefferson Elementary School.

F-3. APPROVAL OF STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

Be It Further Resolved, that included in budget line 620, Budgeted Withdrawal from Capital Reserve Excess Costs & Other Capital Projects is \$200,000 for other capital project costs including \$85,000 for the Hawthorne High School repaving project and \$115,000 for the Jefferson Elementary School repaving project. The total cost of these projects is \$200,000 which represents expenditures for construction elements in addition to the facilities efficiency standards determined by the Commissioner as necessary to achieve the core curriculum content standards.

F-4. Acceptance of the Secretary's and Treasurer's Report for March, 2022 and the Board Secretary certifies that no budgetary line item account has been over expended and that sufficient funds are available to meet the District's financial obligation

F-5. Approval to make the necessary transfers for the period March 1, 2022 through March 31, 2022, for the budget year 2021/2022 in compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:232.11. A list of these transfers is submitted under separate cover and shall be made an integral part of this resolution.
