



# **High School Diploma**

- ☐ Enrollment Requirements:

  Minimum of 100 credits already completed
- ☐ Graduation Requirements: 180 credits
- ☐ Self-Paced Course Work Online - Computer Based



## **High School Diploma Credit Requirements**

The following credits in each subject are required for a high school diploma:

<u>SUBJECT</u>	<b>CREDITS</b>
English	40
Science	30
Fine Arts or Language Other than English	10
Electives	20
World History	10
U.S. History	10
American Government	5
Economics	5
Math (including 1 year of Algebra or above)	30
Career Development	20
TOTAL REQUIRED	180

### **GED Preparation Program**

Prepare for the four parts of the GED test, which include:

- Language Arts
- Social Studies
- Math
- Science

ICEC is an authorized testing site for GED



### **National External Diploma Program (NEDP)**

- Students demonstrate their skills by successfully completing a series of online assignments.
- Students meet in person with their NEDP advisor to review their progress.
- Students who complete NEDP are awarded with a High School Equivalency Diploma.

### **Career Technical Education Programs**

- Business and Computer Education
- Medical Education
- Barber Apprentice





- Medical Terminology
  - Online and In Person Classes
  - High School Diploma or GED required
  - Fee: \$100
- Medical Math
  - Online and In Person Classes
  - High School Diploma or GED required
  - Fee: \$50



#### **Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA)**

- 12 week program
- Covers patient care skills and long term care facilities
- Fee: \$700 (includes textbooks)
- High School Diploma or GED required
- Students provide their own uniforms, physical, and labs





#### **Medical Assistant**

- 18 week program
- Prepares the student to work in the Administrative (front)
   office and Clinical (back) office
- Fee: \$1,200 (includes textbooks)
- High School Diploma or GED required
- Students provide their own uniforms, physical, and labs



#### **Vocational Nursing**

- 18 month program
- Prepares for the NCLEX-PN State of California exam
- Classroom academics and clinical
- Fee: \$5,300

### **Barber Pre-Apprentice**

- Covers the laws and regulations of the Board of Barbering and Cosmetology, basic patron protection, sanitation, disinfection procedures.
- Designed to meet the requirements for entrance into the two-year California Barber Apprenticeship Program (on-the-job training)
- Applicants must have a sponsor and the Establishment Owner's license number
- \$1,500 Fee-Includes Barber Tools and Textbooks
