Regionals State Qualifiers

- Round Times: begins at 10:00 am, continuous rounds with break after round 3.
- Open Format: 5SS G/30;d5
- Sections: K-5, 6-8, 9-12
- Byes: 1 half-point bye any round if declared by round 2
- Registration fee: \$25 ICA Members, \$30 non-ICA Members, \$40/family (Use QR code for payment)
- Requirements: No memberships are needed! No state requirement. Open to all scholastic players. Equipment provided.
- Prizes: trophies for top 1st - 3rd overall in each section, other trophies and medals awarded for state qualifiers, top 3 in each grade. Top School (using top four players from each school).
