**December 1, 2023 Meeting**

**1. DELAC officials present:**

Rodolfina Gamino (President), Israel Orozco (Secretary), Elizabeth Romero (Parliamentarian) and Les Ojeda (Elementary Director of MPD).

**2. Opening:**

Ms. Gamino welcomed everyone including district staff and opened the meeting at 9:34 am.

**3. DELAC Expectations:**

Ms. Consuelo Rubio discussed DELAC expectations and shared her experience at La Cosecha and encouraged parent participation. Ms. Elizabeth Romero welcomed everyone and discussed parent expectations.

**4. Standing Item Superintendent's Cabinet:**

Ms. Applegate was present virtually.

**5. Reflection/Motivational Words:**

Ms. Rodofina Gamino gave some motivational words to those present.

**6. Attendance:**

Ms. Romero called school site attendance.

**7. Minutes:**

Mr. Orozco read the November 3, 2023 meeting minutes. Ms. Claudia Barbosa and Consuelo Rubio made a motion to approve the minutes. The minutes were approved by committee members.

**8. Reclassification of Dually Identified ELs:**

Mr. Ojeda discussed the Reclassification of Dually Identified ELs. Consisting of 1. Assessment of English Language Proficiency. 2. Student's Score on Assessment of Basic Skills. 3. Teacher Evaluation. 4. Parental Opinion and Consultation.

**9. Inland Career Center:**

Mr. Pedraza and Mr. Galdames from the Inland Career Center discussed various programs they offer. For example, English as a Second Language (ESL), GED Preparation Program, High School Diploma Program and National External Diploma Program. 180

credits are requirements to obtain a GED which consist of Language Arts, Social Studies, Mathematics and Science. Inland Career Education Center offers several career technical education classes. They offer a number of computer classes that will help assist with technology skills which are vital in education and in future careers. The barber program teaches students how to cut a variety of hair styles, practice shaving techniques and provide customer service. The Medical programs consist of Medical Math, Medical Terminology, C.N.A. and LVN (\$5,300.00). All these programs are low cost. Support services for students are provided as well, by offering child care, counseling, employment assistance, Financial Aid for College and more. For additional information including registration, contact information was provided.

**10. Loma Linda CHEW:**

Ms. Granillo from Loma Linda CHEW gave a presentation regarding the Community Health and Education Worker (CHEW) Program. The CHEW program is dedicated to uplifting communities and partnering with students and parents to increase educational and health outcomes. Services CHEW provide are home visits/outreach (2,034 home visits conducted for SBCUSD families), resource delivery (30,364 food boxes distributed as well as 1,028,700 diapers distributed in San Bernardino), accompaniment, goal setting, parent health institute (199 participants across 12 Parent Health Institute prestations) and wellness skills. The garden received \$500,000 for this program (My Campus/Shadowing)

**11. Closing:**

Prior to concluding the meeting Ms. Gamino communicated to all present there would be a January celebration, Parent Certification and Café de Padres. The meeting was adjourned by Ms. Gamino at 11:40 am.
