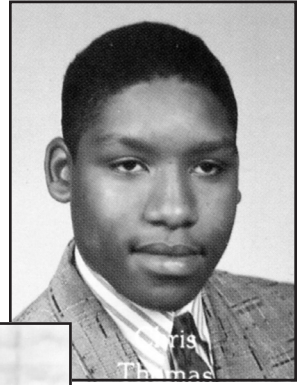
After a brief time with iconic jazz bassist Richard Davis at the University of Wisconsin, he headed to the University of New Orleans to study under leading jazz music educator Ellis Marsalis Jr. and launched his career with Brian Blade and Fellowship.

He has performed around the world including venues such as Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, Kennedy Center and Hollywood Bowl. He also performed and recorded with renowned artists including Harry Connick Jr., Wynton Marsalis, Joshua Redman, Marianne Faithful, Emmylou Harris and more. In 2015, he was nominated for a Grammy with Brian Blade and the Fellowship Band.

During his career, he has played on more than 30 CDs, appeared 10 times on The Late Show with David Letterman and nine times on The Tonight Show with Jay Leno, been on three network specials, 10 European tours, five Asian tours and four featured-film soundtracks.

In the midst of touring and recording, Thomas found time to give back to his alma mater as part of University City Education Foundation's original "Lions of Jazz" in June 1999, helping raise more than \$33,000.

Since 2007, he shared his additional talents as head chef at Flaco's Cocina in U. City; recently seen at Jazz at the Bistro! and currently resides in Paris, France.
