As we approach the end of the first half of the 2023-2024 school year. . . . A few friendly reminders . . .

School begins at 8:05 am - students must be in their seats and ready to learn.

All grade levels (6th, 7th & 8th) enter through Door 9 beginning at 7:30 am. Students that arrive after 8:05 am should enter through Door 1.

Security checks of all bags and purses take place at each entry point. Students are also required to walk through the metal detector scanner and place their cell phone (powered off) in their Yondr bag and lock it. Safety is a priority!

School Policies & Procedures

Student Sign Outs are until 2:45. Students may NOT be signed out between 2:45 pm & dismissal at 3:10 pm. Only guardians may sign out students and they must have a photo I.D.

Absences & Tardy to School

Please contact the main office 330-761-2002 by 8:45 am if your student will be absent. Please refer to the student handbook for excused absences. All absences are not excused even though a guardian calls to report them off.

Food , Drinks & Personal Celebratory Items

Fast food, balloons, cakes and other celebratory items are not permitted to be brought in for breakfast or lunch. Only water is permitted for students to bring to school. Sealed purchased water bottles are acceptable. Refillable water bottles may be brought to school empty and filled at the drinking fountain. All other drinks are prohibited.

Diagnostic Assessment & Weekly Lessons

Student ON GRADE Level ** 45 minutes weekly, 80% mastery on each lesson

Student ONE Grade Level Below 45 minutes weekly, 80% mastery on each lesson

<u>Student TWO or + Grade Levels Below</u> 60 minutes weekly, 80% mastery on each lesson

** 8th grade students ON GRADE Level may complete 30 minutes weekly, but must achieve 85% mastery on each lesson.
