### What is a Family-School Compact?

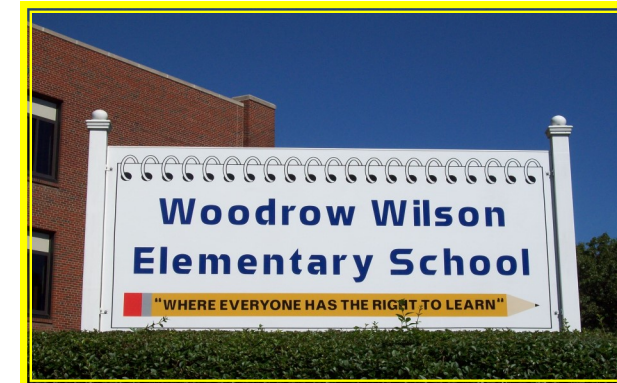

## At Home

Woodrow Wilson school parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' reading ability and comprehension.

- ◆ Encourage my child to read everyday.
- ◆ Participate in any workshops (when I am available) that are offered by the school.
- ◆ Meet and communicate with my child's teacher throughout the year.
- ◆ Check and maintain student communication folders on a daily basis.
- ◆ Provide my child a quiet homework area (if possible) and show them how to organize.

## Students at School and at Home

- ◆ Ask for help from my teacher and family if I am having trouble doing my work.
- ◆ Write down my assignments, do my homework and turn it in on time.
- ◆ Read on my own and/or with my family every day.
- ◆ Arrive at school on time and ready to learn!

## In the 3rd Grade Classroom

The 3rd grade team will work with students and their families to . . .

- ◆ Meet and communicate with parents throughout the year.
- ◆ Provide reading level appropriate books for students to read on their own.
- ◆ Monitor student progress with updates to parents through phone calls and Power School and Parent Square.
- ◆ Make sure each student gets the help he/she needs as soon as it's needed.
- ◆ Send home literacy learning materials and other helpful resources.
- ◆ Use 21st Century instructional practices to ensure we meet the needs of our diverse learners.
- ◆ Ensure students are taught grade level appropriate skills, concepts and are provided with opportunities to apply new learning in real life situations.
- ◆ Collaborate with all stakeholders to ensure that the students needs are met.

- ◆ **(ELA)** Fluently read second grade leveled books
- ◆ **(Math)** Fluently add and subtract within 100 to solve one or two step problems
