If so, you may have made it to Alejandro "Alex" Peres Molina, Rising Sun's Farm Manager. In this month's feature we'll take a look at how Alex Peres' Excellence and Innovation have garnered applause throughout the district.



Born and raised in Michoacán

From turning a green pond clear, to weeding fields and replacing irrigation systems. Alex Peres Molina started to make an impact as soon as he arrived at Rising Sun a year-and-a-half ago. Born in the state of Michoacán, Mexico, Alex moved to the United States when he was 17 and started working as a landscaper, a position that would stick with him for the next 14 years before starting his own handyman and landscaping business in the Bay Area. After relocating to the Central Valley, Alex found himself on the substitute list for PJUSD Custodial and Grounds where he worked for just under a year, performing tasks such as plumbing, electrical, general landscaping, and custodial. At the farm, one of his most recent projects has been working with Operations Coordinator Amy Thorpe in preparing plans for an arboretum style botanical garden comprised of various roses. The project is currently being prepared behind the scenes for next school year, and will feature benches, fountains and walking paths for community members and families to enjoy. With Alex' experience in landscaping, these types of projects are easier to materialize from an idea to reality.

"He's what we've needed here," said Thorpe. "He's excellent when it comes to landscaping and irrigation because of his background and he also brings an ownership to this place in wanting to make it great."

One of his many daily tasks includes caring for the animals, something he hasn't ever done in the past, and one species in particular has seemed to win him over. Alex also appreciates the working environment and having time to make sure projects are done correctly, as opposed to meeting the difficult deadlines he was accustomed to while working as a contractor.
