4. Write down your 8 period day. (Knowing things won't be offered in specific periods, but it helps to visualize)
5. Sign-up for classes in Infinite Campus- Academic Plan.

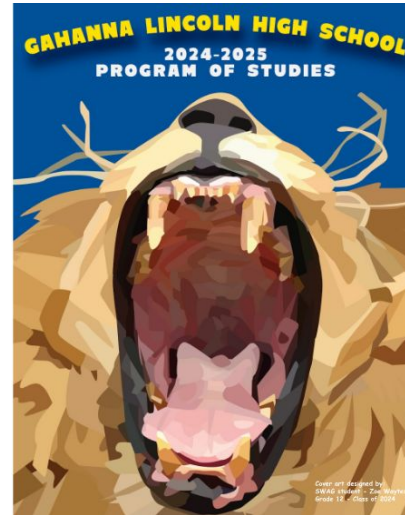

PE Exemptions

- ❖ PE Exemptions can be earned for **two seasons** of a completed school-sponsored sport or by participating in Marching Band (x2) or Chorale (x2)
- ❖ Students **who want to waive the Physical Education graduation requirement based on athletic or Marching Band/ Chorale participation**, need to ensure they participate the entire season and will be required to earn .50 in electives to still have 20 credits earned for graduation
- ❖ You can not mix & match. You need to complete two seasons **OR** complete .50 credits of PE. If you should have questions about this, please see your school counselor.

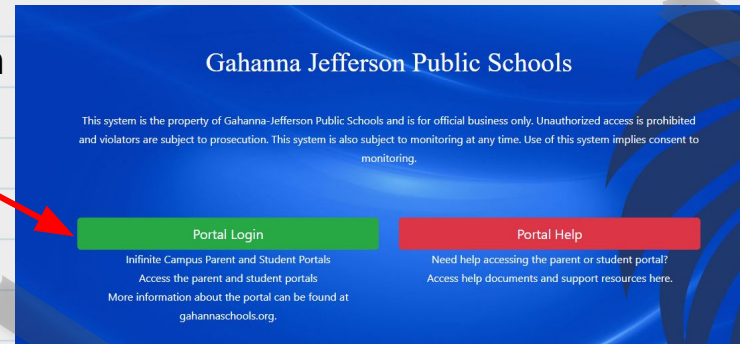

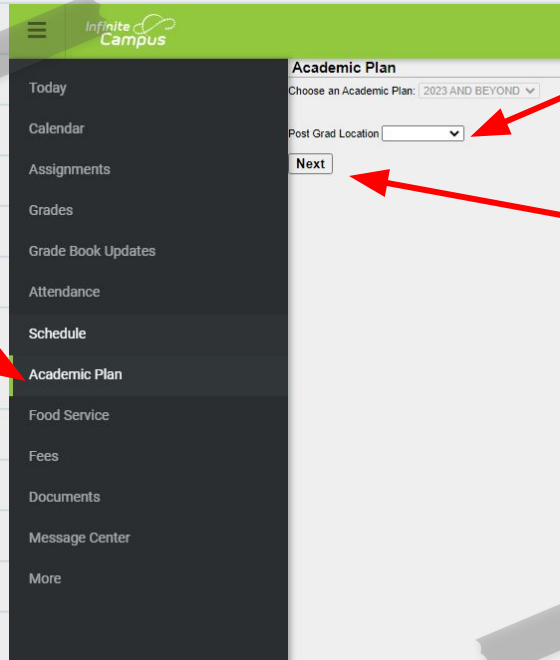


