# School Tour/ Information Gathering Subcommittee

#### What We Did:

- Toured three 4-day school districts.
  Tours included Weiser High School,
  New Plymouth School District,
  Middleton High School, and
  two Middleton elementary schools.
  - Consulted with administrators, teachers, parents, & students.
- Asked questions about experiences, logistics, thoughts, and the effectiveness of a 4-day calendar.
- Researched through phone calls with numerous other school districts in Idaho & Oregon to gather thoughts and experiences.

# Challenges Shared from 4-Day Schools:

- No services on Fridays. Schools did not know for sure how families handle childcare on Fridays.
- One parent shared he felt 4-day increased the burden on parents to help maintain academics for elementary. Other parents disagreed.
  - One elementary principal reported that students with difficult home lives had increased behavior issues before weekends.
- Doesn't seem feasible to return to a 5-day week.
- Requires time management, challenging to fit a 5-day curriculum into 4. Some

## extras have to be cut.

### Of Note:

- 4-day schools contacted was overwhelmingly positive.
- It was difficult identifying challenges within the high praise.
- Schools reported that 4-day was not academically beneficial but felt the benefits were worth it.
- All 4-day districts have a single start time, which is not an option in Emmett due to busing needs.
- Though asked, schools & districts did not provide test scores or other data to reinforce their anecdotal results with 4-day.
- No schools or districts were actively collecting data to compare 4-day results with previous 5-day results.
- All schools have apparently successfully made adjustments to overcome all 4-day challenges.

## Benefits Shared from 4-Day Schools:

- High satisfaction & less stress reported by staff, students, & families.
- Increased job satisfaction & productivity.
  - Decreased absenteeism for staff. Less need for substitutes.
    - More family time.
  - Staff reported feeling more rested.
- Decreased absenteeism for students & staff. Less need for substitutes.
  - More time for teen work opportunities.
- Opportunities for appointments on 5th day.
- Positive impact on morale, school climate, & energy.
  - Increased job satisfaction & productivity.
  - Perception is that everyone is happier.
    - Teachers said they would never return to a 5 day week.
