WHEREAS, the Board requires the services of a design professional to serve as the criteria architect and provide related services for the Project

WHEREAS, the district solicited a proposal from BDT to provide criteria architect services for the Project for \$19,250.00

WHEREAS, the proposal is not subject to a qualification-based selection process, as Ohio Revised Code Section 153.71(B)(1) permits the selection a criteria architect without implementing a qualifications-based selection process when the compensation for services will be less than \$25,000.00 for a project

WHEREAS, the Superintendent recommends the Board select BDT as the criteria architect for the Project and authorize the negotiation and execution of a contract for criteria architect services for the Project with BDT in the amount of \$19,250.00

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE GALLIPOLIS CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT, COUNTY OF GALLIA, STATE OF OHIO, as follows:

- 1. The Board selects BDT as the criteria architect for the project
- 2. The Board authorizes the Superintendent and Treasurer to work with legal counsel to negotiate and sign the criteria architect agreement and other documents that may be necessary to fully execute the criteria architect agreement on behalf of the Board in the amount not to exceed \$19,250.00
