NEW DINUBA HIGH SCHOOL

Phase 1 of your new high school is changing the skyline view of our community and ushering in a new horizon filled with fresh hope and promise. Your new high school represents hope for our students; our goal is to provide as many opportunities for our students as they move towards graduation. Building a new high school is a transformative moment in our city's history. Besides a two-story wing with 54 classrooms, there will be 4 Career Technical Education buildings. These unique buildings include Agriculture, Medical Academy, Construction Management Academy, and Transportation buildings. Phase one of your new high school is being built with state bond funds and grants without local tax obligations!

However, additional funding will be required to develop phase 2 of our high school and modernize our elementary and junior high schools to promote safety and maximize security. Many of our schools were built in the 1950s and 1960s, requiring more safety and security measures, modernized bathrooms, and updated facilities.

Safe schools remain one of our two top priorities. We are continually looking for ways to make our schools safer. We have hired a full-time Safe School Officer and 2 City of Dinuba School Resource Officers. We have a School District Safety Task Force and implemented safe school reviews at all of our sites.

As we begin a new year, we also hope to retain our standing as the highest-performing district in Math and English in Tulare County. We offer many extra-curricular activities at our schools, including Extended Learning Opportunities at our elementary school sites until 6 PM.

What is Chronic Absenteeism? Students who miss 10% of school days for any reason, (excused, unexcused, ect.) are considered chronically absent. It's a warning sign that students are experiencing challenges and are missing out on classroom instruction.

Chronic absenteeism significantly impacts a variety of student outcomes including mathematics and reading achievement, social-emotional development, grade retention and dropout (Balfanz & Byrnes, 20218: Gottfried, 2017). Reducing the amount of absences students receive will benefit students in the long run.

Intersession Camp 2023-2024

The 2023-24 Intersession Camp is an enrichment program for 1st and 2nd grade students. There will be 15, 9-hour days of this program and the Dinuba Unified ELO-P team will be enrolling 80 students.

The Agriculture and FFA program is a 7-12 hands-on career technical program that develops students' potential for premier leadership, personal growth and career success. Students earn University of California A-G science and art credit and can also receive Dual Enrollment credit through local community colleges. Dinuba FFA offers Floriculture, Vet Science, and Nursery/Landscape as their Spring CDEs who compete at local high schools, community colleges, and universities providing higher education tours and exposure.



The Nursery/Landscape team is the 2023 California State Champions and will be team California at the national contest this October in Indianapolis, Indiana. Students are also being recognized at the National Convention for earning their American FFA Degrees, the highest degree honor National FFA can bestow upon a student.

Our Supervised Agriculture Experience (SAE) projects allow students to engage in an agriculture project of their choosing outside of class time. One of our most popular SAE projects is livestock animals and we just finished up with the Tulare County Fair. We had over 30 students showing beef, hogs, goats, and lambs and competing in market and showmanship contests.
