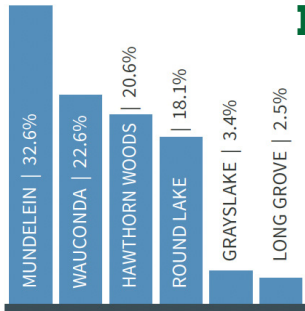
SCHOOL DISTRICT 79



Fremont School District 79's origin story dates back to the mid-1800s when there were eight one-room schools located throughout Fremont Township. It wasn't until the mid-1950s when several of the remaining one-room schools were consolidated into one brand-new school building on Tekampe Road (now Fremont Center Road), just south of Ivanhoe Farms.

From 150 students at the time of Fremont School's opening in 1957 to an enrollment of nearly 2,100 students in its four schools today, FSD79 has grown with the times. Located on a beautiful 140-acre campus, Fremont has become one of the most desirable school districts in Lake County. The District's commitment to providing the highest-quality education remains steadfast and celebrated by our community.

FSD79's boundary map consists of seven different villages, with the largest percentage of students hailing from Mundelein, followed by Wauconda, Hawthorn Woods, Round Lake, Grayslake, and Long Grove. A small portion of Libertyville also lies within District boundaries, though no students currently reside in that village.

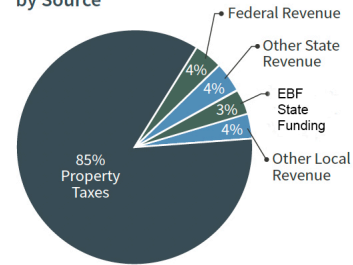

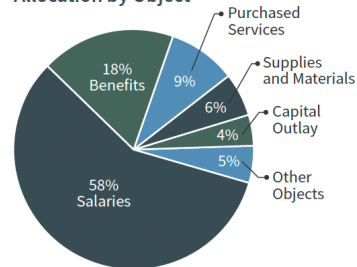
