COURSE DESCRIPTION

Piano II will review the content and techniques from the Piano 1 course. Students will review basic music notation for pitch, rhythm and other music theory concepts while continuing their development of rehearsal and performance skills. This course will explore various key signatures, Circle of Fifths, chord progressions, and scales to develop a deeper understanding of music theory and piano playing. All exercises and repertoire will continue to increase in difficulty, as appropriate. By the end of this course, students will have experience in live performance, as a soloist, an accompanist, and as a member of an ensemble.

PROCEDURES AND EXPECTATIONS

In addition to the school-wide policies outlined in the student handbook and/or provided by PRHS administration, please observe the following guidelines:

- **Take care of the equipment, materials, and space.** After using the keyboard lab, keyboards must be turned off and headphones hung up properly at the end of class. Students are expected to keep all keyboard stands and bench end caps attached to the equipment. When erasing, students should blow the eraser shavings away from the keyboards to avoid damaging the keys and speakers. Students will be held financially responsible for causing any damage to the equipment. Students should throw away any trash to ensure that nothing is left behind where they were sitting. **Only water bottles with lids will be permitted in class.**
- **Keyboards must be gently wiped with disinfection wipes before and after use.** Please keep the space clean and safe for everyone.
- **Complete all hand-written assignments in pencil.** Anything completed in pen or any other writing utensil will not be accepted - NO exceptions.
- **Submit work on time.** Late assignments will receive a 10% deduction per school day. If a missing assignment is submitted after a grade has been inputted, students should send an email to Ms. Park and include the week of the folder. Assignments that have already been reviewed in class will not be accepted.
- **Be proactive about missed instruction.** In the event of an absence, it is the student's responsibility to make up any assignments, to submit any work that was collected, to review any content that was covered, and to schedule any make-up assessments.

- **Stay organized.** Students should keep all materials organized in a three-ring binder with pages numbered accordingly.
- **Seek help when needed.** If you are struggling with a particular concept, need further clarification on a lesson, need additional practice resources, etc., please do not hesitate to reach out to Ms. Park.
- **Demonstrate integrity.** Students must not use any materials or resources that are not permitted for an assignment or assessment, as well as pass off anyone else's work as their own.
