As noted above, our schools are closed for instruction today in observance and recognition of Dr. Martin Luther King Junior. Therefore, if you have the chance, please take a moment today to reflect upon and to discuss with your family the amazing accomplishments of Dr. King and the profound impact he has had on our nation and culture, particularly how he taught us how to appreciate the differences in others and to protest peacefully against prejudice and discrimination so as to ensure

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Last Monday evening, the SWMHS Guidance Department and Tricia Mayers, a representative from the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority (HESAA), provided almost 50 families with an overview of the importance of completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and assisted them with the completion of the new FAFSA, which just opened their soft launch last week. Any 12<sup>th</sup> grader, regardless of income, who wants to be considered for federal, state, and school financial aid programs, including grants, scholarships, work-study funds, and loans, is encouraged to complete the FAFSA with their parents/guardians right away.
