



K-12 Protocol for COVID-19 Continuity of Instruction Quarantine Due to COVID + or Close Contact for Unvaccinated Students

- Nurse should verify the need for a student to quarantine with the principal/teacher.
 - Once verified; the nurse will contact the Attendance & Enrollment Department, Divisional Principal, and the student's teachers.
- Remoting into class will not be an option for the 2021-2022 school year.
- Asynchronous work will be provided for COVID-19 quarantine or isolation.
- Teachers need a one-day lag time to prepare student work in Schoology and/or through physical materials to be picked up/sent home (packets, worksheets, manipulatives, etc.).
- Teachers will check-in with students, periodically, throughout the duration of their quarantine to answer questions and provide support.
- Work will be provided for a determined length of time depending on the type of quarantine or for up to 10 days for a COVID positive diagnosis.
- Students who are quarantined may choose to submit their work daily/in accordance with the teacher's expectations for their assignments or have up to the number of days missed to complete and turn in all assignments for the time period they were out sick.
- Questions regarding assignments should be sent to the child's teacher. The teacher will respond within 24 hours.

Rationale:

Asynchronous work allows the teacher to focus on the in-person students during the school day, as well as handle questions from quarantined students when time allows. Asynchronous work also allows parents to support their children at times that are more convenient for them without having to work within the time constraints of the school day. It also decreases the need for extended screen time each day.
