

Bilingual IBDP Course Choice Worksheet

SPANISH

To fill out a full Diploma Program, choose a course from each of the six areas. Three but not more than four classes must be taken at the higher level (HL). The remaining courses must be studied at the standard level (SL). A student may take only two SL exams at the end of the 11th grade year that will count toward the diploma. Additional SL exams may be taken that year and declared as extra subjects. *Students will be eligible for the Bilingual IB Diploma by completing 2 languages selected from Group 1 with the award of 3 or higher in both OR by completing one Group 3 subject in a language other than English.
